### **APRIL BOARD BRIEFS**

Spring has really taken hold in Heritage Hunt. It is great to see so many folks out and about on our many sport courts, golf course, walking paths and just enjoying our great community. We have also been busy inside. The Facilities Committee is finishing work on redecoration of the Clubhouse and the Food/Beverage Committee has gotten acoustic tiles set in the ROBG bar area which has helped with noise levels. Do stop in the Clubhouse to see what Facilities has done and then stop in the ROBG for lunch, dinner or our very popular Sunday Brunches.

Also, all of the Committees and the Board are hard at work on their 2024 goals. These are listed on the individual website pages of the Committees and the Board so all can see what the goals and the action items associated with each one are. If you have questions about goals or the status of any of them, do contact the Board or the Committees and ask for more information. All of us need to know exactly what is happening or planned to happen in Heritage Hunt.

Do know that the Board is very aware of our obligation to make sure that Administrative Resolution #23/Standard Operating Procedures #2, Heritage Hunt Board Transparency is followed. We make every effort to transmit to the community information using all our communication venues available and that includes our meetings/minutes. Residents who seek more information on any and all topics should send those issues to the Board so they can be addressed.

We also encourage all residents to attend Committee meetings and follow along on their projects. Often work groups are created and volunteers needed so do consider any opportunity to join in creating a better Heritage Hunt.

And speaking of encouraging, the Board encourages and asks (again) that all residents follow the traffic rules we have set in place. Watch your speed, STOP AT STOP signs as you are obligated to look all ways for other cars and pedestrians of which we have many. The Prince William Country Police do patrol in Heritage Hunt and they do have permission to ticket. Let's all avoid the chance of

getting a ticket and just follow the established rules.

The following resolutions were approved at the February 22, 2024 Board Meeting. Due to Horn publishing dates they are appearing a month late. For a quicker update, check the Board of Directors page on the website where the meeting minutes are posted within 2 weeks of the meeting date.

- Approved revisions to Administrative Resolution #23/Standard Operating Procedures/SOP #2 (Executive Minutes) and SOP #3 (appointed/elected Committees).
- Approved funds in the amount of \$2,000 from the Operating Budget to allow the Facilities Committee to purchase flowers and seasonal decorations for the Clubhouse lobby.
- Approved reallocating the remaining balance of the approved Clubhouse Renovation Reserve budget of \$10,704 from Fiscal Year 2023 to Fiscal Year 2024.

wonderful service to our residents. It is time for the Dunns to step down and a new helper to emerge. If you can volunteer for this position, it would be very helpful!


#### WE NEED YOU!

#### ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI)



# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

# RECENT EVENTS SPOTLIGHT THE NEED FOR BEING PREPARED

Two recent events involving a gas explosion that destroyed a home, and the loss of cell phone service have put the spotlight on prevention and readiness. Although these incidences did not happen at Heritage Hunt, they serve as a reminder that the unexpected can occur at anytime, anywhere.

Prevention begins with routine maintenance, so schedule an A/C check up in the Spring, and a Furnace checkup in Fall. Preventative measures keep us safe and our equipment lasting longer. We recently had a resident who forgot to get their seasonal checkup and it resulted in all the gas to the house being turned off (during a freeze!) Another resident's water pipes burst during a freeze because they forgot to do their cold-weather preparations and maintenance. And to make it worse, neither were in the area when these disasters happened. So many lessons to learn from this. In addition to regular maintenance on your home, have a neighbor watch the house for you when you are out of the area and give them access in case an official emergency responder, like Columbia Gas, needs access. And speaking of gas lines and emergencies, think Miss Utility – call before you dig outside (we know, it's spring and now is the time to make those landscaping dreams come true). If by chance, you happen to hit a utility line, or while doing spring cleaning you come across that gas smell that you can't place, remember - "smell, call, leave". Call 911 and leave the premises but stay close enough to engage with the Utility Company technician when they arrive. There are several internet sources with maintenance reminders for you to track and follow. For example, some still get emails with monthly maintenance reminders from their home inspector they used when they bought their home years ago. Which reminds us, better check the batteries in your fire and carbon monoxide alarms, update your File of Life hanging on the refrigerator, and order that KNOX box! What's on your list for this month?

The second incident involved AT&T cell phone service disruption across the Southern United State. Fortunately, Heritage Hunt residents did not experience the loss of this very important link

which during an emergency could be life threatening. However, what we all believe to be highly unlikely, our cell phones not working, did occur. Therefore, the EPC has anticipated this as part of our readiness. When phone service becomes interrupted, our Emergency Volunteers will be visible in your neighborhood with their yellow vests and walkie talkies. Just let them know you have an emergency and they will be able to radio in details to our Zone Directors about the need for emergency assistance. Then, thanks to support from the Heritage Hunt Ham Radio Club, we will be able to use ham radios to communicate



between the Zones and with outside emergency services, who are also available on the ham radio frequencies when phone service is out. This photo shows one of our ham radio

stations in the Emergency Coordination Center. Each year the EPC conducts an Exercise with our Emergency Volunteers and the Ham Radio Club to be prepared for events such as the loss of cell service.



However, the EPC is not just for emergencies when the power goes off or the cell phone service is lost. The EPC regularly provides safety and health

training to perform Hands Only CPR, Stop-the-Bleed, or use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) as shown in the photo. For updates on these training sessions, send a request for information to cprhhepc@gmail.com. Remember, this training will prepare you to help save the life of a neighbor, friend, or family member in a medical emergency.

#### **GARDEN CLUB**

Our April 25 meeting will be at 10am in Marsh Mansion and will feature a talk on Bluebirds by Valerie Kenyon Gaffney, President of the Virginia Bluebird Society. Come join us!

"Garden as if life depends on it" (Dr. Doug Tallamy, University of Delaware professor)

Several of us from Garden Club recently attended the 6th Prince William Native Plant Symposium held at George Mason University in Manassas. The theme of the program was Dr. Tallamy's message, which is to promote environmentally sound gardening and landscaping. Here are some of his thoughts:

Have you ever thought about what happens when a native wooded are is cleared for a building site? After the trees and undergrowth have been removed, what happens to the creatures that were living in or visiting the area? When a local habitat is removed, local extinction takes place. As more and more habitats disappear, this creates a stress on nature and its inhabitants. We can assist nature by providing our own landscaping with native plants and wild spaces. The new motto is Stop Mowing, Start Growing. This doesn't mean to let your lawn grow completely wild. However, maintaining a smaller lawn is highly beneficial in many ways: reduced water usage and less chemicals. Less maintenance equals less cost to the homeowner and more enrichment of nature.

Land set aside as natural preserves does not provide enough habitats for healthy ecosystems. We need corridors of native plants to keep sustaining wildlife and biodiversity. There are new bills within our state legislature to protect conservation landscaping. Similar bills have passed in Maryland and New Jersey with bipartisan support. Planting natives is a grassroots approach to conservation in our own yards and is something we can all do. Here at Heritage Hunt, we can do our part by substituting native plants whenever our gardens lose a shrub or perennial.

Come to Garden Club to hear more about how our community can contribute to a healthy environment! And come to share your garden issues and learn solutions to your design challenges.

Tip of the month:

Do you have an ancestor whose last name at birth was, let's say, Joan Brown. Suppose her biological father died when she was a child and her mother remarried later, taking on a different surname. Do you need the surname of the stepfather for purposes of researching "Joan Brown"? Yes, because "Joan Brown" may appear listed in a record (church and census records for example) under the surname of her stepfather.

Our Genealogy Club welcomes Heritage Hunt residents to our monthly meetings and begin their own genealogy adventures — and, in the process, make new friends. Everyone has family history stories to happily share with others — a wonderful ice breaker!

Markus Crewe, Exec Director, Habitat for Humanity will highlight a neighborhood revitalization program that helps disabled and



low-income seniors. The grant awarded helped a disabled veteran stay in his home by providing funds to repair the veteran's fence and remove trash from his front and back yards.



John Swirchak, CEO Literacy Volunteers of America-PWC will discuss how they provide dignity and inspiration to low-literate and their underserved clients. Their program

B4Literacy/B4HealthLiteracy integrates health literacy with their English-based classes. Expanding the scope to include health-related topics required retooling and printing of materials and the Giving Circle grant was spent on printing new materials.

Pat Victorson - President of National Alliance on Mental Illness, PWC, will discuss their programs on Youth and Family Mental Health. Programs include workshops that help parents and caregivers to distinguish between typical childhood behaviors and



those that may require intervention. 'Ending the Silence' presentations raise awareness of warning signs of a mental health condition and suicide and how to approach a crisis. Their Giving Circle Grant funded a workshop and six of the presentations.

Talya Conroy, Executive Director, of the ARTfactory will discuss programs for children and adults. The ARTful Wellness Program is an opportunity for individuals in under-served

communities to take visual and performing arts classes free of charge. Classes support mental wellness and assist in decreasing anxiety, depression & stress. The Giving Circle grant will provide scholarships to approximately 85 persons.

### **GOLF COMMITTEE NEWS**

**RECIPROCALS.** During suspension of play on the Heritage Hunt (HH) Golf course during the Tahoma 31 grass installation, resident golf annual members and non-resident golf annual members may be able to play other courses in the area through a reciprocal. A reciprocal is a courtesy round offered by a club or course (participating course) to a non-member golfer at a discounted rate when play on the non-member golfer's home course is unavailable. Please note that reciprocal play is primarily a courtesy among golf courses, and there are no official reciprocal agreements. Participating courses offer limited tee times based on availability, and non-member golfers must request reciprocals through their home course pro shop.



Currently, within a 60-mile radius of HH, 37 courses have agreed to honor reciprocals to eligible HH resident golf annual members and non-resident golf annual members in some capacity. Participating course fees will

be offered to these HH golfers at a discounted rate. In the near future, the list of courses offering reciprocals and their respective fees will be posted on the bulletin board outside the pro shop, and eligible HH golf members as described above should anticipate receiving a letter about the reciprocal process active during the Tahoma 31 installation.

Because the courtesy of reciprocal play is between golf courses, eligible HH golfers may ask for reciprocal tee times at a participating golf course through the HH pro shop only. Often, participating courses do not offer a reciprocal discounted rate when directly requested from a non-member golfer.

COURTESIES TO GROUND MAINTENANCE STAFF(GMS). Despite daily and frequent use, the HH Golf course continues to be in great, playable condition. This is due in immeasurable part to the hard work of the GMS. As spring-like weather emerges and daylight dawns earlier, the GMS arrive before dawn to prepare the course for play throughout the day. So please show courtesy and patience to the GMS while they are on course working.

If an incident arises for you to question the conduct of a GMS member, please contact the Golf Committee at golfcommittee@heritagehunt.net who will address your concern as appropriate.

Alternately, however, feel free to smile and wave to members of the GMS to show your gratitude for their work and dedication.



# HH CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN WINE SOCIETY

Bucking one of the more common sayings about April, I've always thought the month is as much about flowers as it is about showers, thanks to everything greening up and flowering. April is also an important time in our Virginia vineyards as it is often when the vines experience bud break, when nodes on the vines burst, becoming new shoots and leaves. The timing of bud break varies depending on the grape variety, weather, the aspect and elevation of the vineyard. This is a time when Virginia vineyard owners closely watch the weather, as an April frost can seriously damage vines, particularly those which bud early such as Chardonnay. So, fingers crossed we see no frost at our Virginia vineyards this spring; we're counting on many of those lovely buds becoming wine grapes!



While March is officially Women's History Month and features the National Women in Wine Day which celebrates women shaping the wine industry, our April wine program is when we will


