#### **AUGUST BOARD BRIEFS**

As a Neil Diamond fan, I do recall "Hot August Nights" and it seems as if Neil was a bit ahead on July. Let's see what August can offer us in the way of some cooler nights but still some great August days to enjoy all the outdoor activities that Heritage Hunt can offer.

AND after all the great outdoors, come indoors to the Red Oak Bar and Grill (ROBG) and enjoy the great food and customer service that CulinArt has brought to Heritage Hunt. The 7/4 BBQ was terrific and the food trucks were great fun. However, we are back into the ROBG now and getting back to an exciting "new" normal. So, head for the ROBG to check out the new menu and to meet/greet staff, most of whom we know very well.

After getting our Food/Beverage vendor in place, we are moving ahead on finding a new Golf Course Vendor. The Board, with much help from the Golf Committee, has created a scope of work for an RFP that went out to 11 firms in mid-July. We expect replies back by mid-September. The Board plans to make a decision by the end of Sept for that firm to start 1/1/25. In the meantime, UTP has a 6 month contract to work the regrassing project and maintain the course/pro shop until 12/31/24.

We are also working with Prince William Water (the new name for Prince William County Service Authority) as we start into what should be the final months of finishing the pump station and 24" force main projects. Unexpected delays have caused this project to go over the planned completion time for these projects. They still have demo work to be done on the old building plus adding landscaping and working on some road repairs. With all that left to do it appears that PWW will be here until the end of 2024. We will continue to update the community as we get more exact dates from PWW.

AND, as this is August, it is time for all of us to start thinking about volunteering for open seats on the Board and the Committees. To get us started we will have a Meet the Board and Meet the Committees session on Friday August 30th starting at 10 am in the Clubhouse Ballroom. While there will be an opportunity for interested residents to meet current Board and Committee members, we will be doing something very different for this meeting. Representatives from the Board and each Committee will start at 10 am reviewing what their responsibilities are and answering questions. Residents are encouraged to send questions ahead

of time for the Board or any Committee to them so their representatives are prepared to answer. We feel that a good back and forth will help everyone understand exactly what each group does for the Association. There will also be an open question and answer period. So, save the date and come to learn how you can help with maintaining Heritage Hunt as a great place to live, play, thrive.

The following resolutions were approved by the Board at the 6/27/24 meeting. Because of Horn publishing deadlines, they are appearing here a month late. For a quicker review and update, do check the Community website where minutes will be online within 2 weeks of the meeting.

- Approved revisions to Administrative Resolution #8 - Voting and Candidate Eligibility. \*\*\*
- Approved a contract with Culinarts for Food & Beverage Services.
- Approved repairs to the Paddock Pond fountain.
- Approved increasing budget for Excursions.
- Approved revisions to the Community Relations Committee Charter.
- Approved the Golf Committee to work with Aquatic Solutions on long term algae solutions on Box Elder Pond.
- · Approved additional algae treatments to stream on Hole #2 and biologic treatments on Box Elder pond to control algae growth for the remainder of 2024 at a cost NTE \$1,500.
- Approved buying water from Prince William Water to maintain water levels in Box Elder Pond as that pond is used for golf course irrigation.

\*\*\* Revisions to Administrative Resolution #8 -Voting and Candidate Eligibility include: (1) Members can serve on an elected and appointed Committee. However, should the appointed Committee become elected than they can only serve on one, (2) The number/names of declared candidates for the Board/Committees will be announced for each of 3 weeks before the end of candidate declarations, (3) Candidate names will go on the ballot in alphabetical order, (4) The ballot will reflect all candidate names and the number of openings to be voted for. (5) Elections results will be published.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

## WHAT WE DO WHEN THE PHONES DON'T WORK

The Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) knows how important communications are in an emergency. Therefore, we developed a strong relationship with the Heritage Hunt Ham Radio Club, with their Emergency Volunteers (EVs) providing the backbone for our communications when home and cell phones stopped working. Hams radios will be used to not only facilitate voice communication but also text messaging between our Zones and our Central Communication Center. In addition, during emergencies these Ham Radio EVs will use their radios to communicate with Prince William County emergency services.

So how do we ensure we can keep the lines of communication open? By participating in the Ham Radio Field Day, where our EPC emergency generators power 24 hours of Ham Radio operations. This year a Heat Advisor provided an opportunity to operate under realistic conditions. All the planning for Field Day under a tent changed and operations were relocated into the Marsh Mansion. New location for antennas were found and generators were used with extension cords into the Garden Room.



We are pleased to report, under these chaotic conditions, the Ham Radio Club was able to operate for 24 hours as shown by the President of the Heritage

Hunt Ham Club, Dick Allardyce. All this equipment was operated using our emergency generators, and these Ham EVs will be bringing these same ham radios and computers to our Zones and Communication Center during weather and other emergencies that impact communications at Heritage Hunt.

So, if you are a Ham Radio operator or interested in becoming one, the Heritage Hunt Ham Radio Club meets monthly and supports not only the EPC, but other activities such as the Annual Cancer Walk. Details on the Club can be found at https://www.heritagehunt.net/amenities/heritage-hunt-hams. To learn more about the size of Heritage Hunt, and why we need Ham radio operators, the Heritage Hunt Map showing our Zones can be found on the HH website under Member Home.

The success in supporting health and safety at Heritage Hunt relies on our EVs. Not only those with Ham Radios, but also other skills.

Therefore, the EPC was very honored to recognize Mary Gorodnick, who brought her skills in nursing to our quarterly Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (PCR) training and support for those participating in the yearly Cancer Walks.

#### **GARDEN CLUB**

#### DEAR GARDENERS

Garden Club held its 2nd annual tea party event in June! Tea and conversation flowed and our favorite bee guy, Tagg Timm, came to offer his local honey with samples and bee wisdom. In July we heard about hummingbirds from the Audubon Society of Northern Virginia. Join us on August 22 at 10:00 in Marsh Mansion to hear Valerie Huelsman, natural resources specialist and master gardener coordinator with Virginia Cooperative Extension's Prince William unit. Valerie is an arborist and will cover topics such as remedies for spotted lanternflies and ways to control them.

The best thing we can do at this time of year is let August be August. It will surely be hot and dry. There are many things you can do for your August garden, but keeping your flowers, trees, and shrubs well hydrated and healthy will allow them to continue to give beauty through the last weeks of summer. Lawn is another issue - it may become necessary for the county to restrict lawn watering due to low rainfall. This is why we encourage less lawn on our properties and it may be time to relax covenants regarding lawn dimensions.

Continue your deadheading after each flush of flowers and throughout the entire summer, but stop deadheading a few weeks before the first frost date. Deadheading produces more new growth that could be vulnerable to cold weather. Late Summer (late August to mid-September) is an excellent time to plant many perennials. It is also a good time to move or divide perennials. When pruning, disinfect your tools between each plant to avoid spreading disease. Low Maintenance Perennials: Shasta Daisy, Coneflower, Rose Mallow Hibiscus, Catmint, Goldenrod, Mountain Mint, Bee Balm, Butterfly Weed, Coral Bells, and Astilbe (for shade).

If you've been putting off weeding, now's the time. As the growing season winds down, weeds start to produce seeds that will happily germinate next Spring. The best time to weed is after a rain, but if rainfall is scarce, water the garden the night before you want to get started.



LVA-PW's holistic approach to adult education teaches skills that help individuals to – 1.) engage in day-to-day conversations with confidence; 2.) improve English-language skills (reading, writing, vocabulary, comprehension, and pronunciation); 3.) learn critical thinking (how to organize thoughts, filter out misinformation, and clearly express their opinions); 4.) acquire a level of health literacy that helps them understand complex health-related information, including ehealth portals and telemedicine.

On April 24, 2024, LVA-PW's CEO, John Swirchak (see photo) presented information about his organization's goals to Giving Circle members and HH residents in the Clubhouse Ballroom. Also, Mr. Swirchak advised attendees that a 2023 grant from the Giving Circle helped them expand the scope of their curriculum to include more health-

related topics and retool educational material for their broad array of programs and increased number of clients. He ended by expressing his



sincere thanks to and reconfirming that all donations **DO MAKE A DIFFERENCE** in the lives of those who are helped, and the difference could be for a lifetime.

In 2023, **The Giving** 

Circle of Heritage Hunt awarded \$91,700 to 17 different local charities, one of which was LVA-PW. Every dollar donated by members went directly into a grant to help those in need in the categories of – 1.) food; 2.) clothing, 3.) shelter, 4.) literacy, 5.) mental health, and 6.) physical health. In October 2024, when grants are again awarded, The Giving Circle hopes to do even more, due to an increase in members and almost \$100,000 in pledges.



#### **GOLF COMMITTEE NEWS**

### TAHOMA 31 INSTALLATION PROJECT BEGINS

#### **Preparation for Installation**

Monday, June 10, marked the first day of the Tahoma 31 (T31) Grass Installation Project. The HH Golf Course Maintenance Crew treated the fairways and driving range with an herbicide and fungicide to kill the existing turf and sterilize the soil. Irrigation of the course continued during application of the herbicide in order to keeps the plants growing to properly absorb the herbicide. Irrigation also continued for the maintenance of the rough and the greens. This procedure was repeated during the course closure on Mondays June 17 and 24 and July 1 and 8. Preparation was completed on July 8 after the last application of the herbicide.

#### **Installation Process**

As of this writing on July 10, it is anticipated that on July 15, an outside contractor will double aerate the fairways and immediately start installation of the T31 sprigs. Successful installation of the turf sprigs is weather-dependent; therefore, the installation was scheduled for several days.

Simultaneously the tee boxes will have the existing grass cut free, leveled, soil prepared followed by T31 sod installation. Sod installation can take more time than the sprigs. After installation, the new turf will require extensive application of fertilizer and chemicals along with consistent irrigation to ensure the sprigs and sod grow in healthy and quickly.

During the installation project, the turf on the driving range will be replaced with T31 Grass. Also, tee boxes will be refreshed and sodded with T31 Grass.

You can follow the continuing progress of the T31 installation with pictures posted on the bulletin boards outside the pro shop and on the HHTV Golf News.

He won the National Hot Rod Association (NHRA) East Coast Championship in E Gas (highly modified engines) in 1957, 1958 and 1960 competing at racetracks from New York to North Carolina. Local recognition includes being awarded the 2010 Cliff Ewell Memorial Award at the Annual Legends of Racing celebration sponsored by Old Dominion Raceway. Mr. Robinson also received the Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of being the first African American to participate in organized drag racing on the East Coast. At this meeting he shared a binder of photos and newspaper clips including where Robbie was the only Black member of a local hot-rod club, the Igniters, or the "fly in the buttermilk".

Beyond his racing days, Mr. Robinson has led an amazing life over the last 94 years. He worked at Cameron Station for over 39 years including becoming the first civilian to bag groceries after Congress declared grocery bagging by military members was considered servitude. He later became Deputy Commissary Officer before he went to the Defense Logistics Agency where he retired in 2010 as Chief of Operations in the DLA Command Control Center, or the War Room. He also has decades of service in the Elks Lodge which



was one of few places to provide social activities for blacks in the early 1950's, and has been a lifelong advocate for community welfare and youth education groups and organizations. Notable achievements including serving on the board of Directors of Project Discovery-Alexandria for six year and as a member of the City of Alexandria Martin Luther King, Jr. Planning Committee for over 49 years. In 1983, Robinson was presented an award by the Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) at T. C. Williams High School as one of the Outstanding Black Business Leaders in Alexandria. He was also instrumental in promoting the Marting Luther King Jr. Memorial and ensuring his birthday is recognized each year.

Robinson is a proud 6th generation grandson of Gentleman Jim Robinson, who at the time of the Civil War owned part of what is now the historic Bull Run Battlefield. Gentleman Jim's home. Robinson House, is today a battlefield tourist attraction and Gentleman Jim is buried nearby. He and his wife Evangeline "Van" have a son Warren and daughter Sharon. Warren was a wide receiver on the 1971 T.C. Williams High School football team, later captured in the movie "Remember the Titans." In 1956 their youngest daughter 11th month old Debbie died as a result of being turned away from a hospital because they were black. Through it all Robbie Robinson has served as a role model and advocate for youth while maintaining a positive attitude and willingness to share his story with anyone.

## **TEARS**

#### COL. JAMES L. RIFFE



Like at least two patriots (John Adams, Thomas Jefferson) before him, World War II veteran and longtime Heritage Hunt resident Col. James (Jim) L. Riffe (retired) passed away early on Independence Day.

Jim and Bea, his wife of 70 years, moved to Heritage Hunt in 2003. Jim was a MOAA member, and presented Clubhouse programs about WW II history.

July 9th would have been his 103rd birthday. To honor his service and 99th and 100th birthdays in July 2020 and 2021, neighbors and friends surprised him with tribute parades that included local fire and rescue teams, the Washington, DC Chapter of 82nd Airborne Association, Gainesville's Mission BBQ and Honor Brewing Company.

In 2017 Riffe gave an extensive oral history of his military career, which included the WW II Battle of Okinawa, to a HH production team that included Lynn McIntosh, Nike Ide, Ruth Hill, and Riffe's Airborne friend Mike Lonetto. That recording is available online at the Library of Congress website and Nick Ide's YouTube channel https://youtu.be/xpjJoSp\_gJUl.

Friends of the National World War II Memorial frequently called on Riffe in recent years to speak about the war at events such as the September 2, 1945 anniversary of the Japanese surrender, and teachers' educational meetings.

Born in McDowell County, WV in 1921 near the coal fields, he became an under-age member of the Civilian Conservation Corps during the Great Depression, and helped develop a West Virginia state park. In June, 1941 he graduated valedictorian of his class, and received six athletic scholarships. He chose Davidson college in North



Carolina because it allowed him to play both football and basketball. But war intervened, and shortly after Pearl Harbor, he registered in February 1942 for the draft and went on active duty in August.

Following officers training at Ft. Benning, GA, Riffe got orders to the Pacific and assumed command of 1st Platoon, I Company, 106th Infantry Regiment, 27th Infantry Division – which he led during the April – May, 1945 Battle of Okinawa. He suffered shrapnel wounds to his back in that battle during an explosion that killed one of his teammates.

Riffe continued his Army career following the war, during which he held various command and staff positions. He deployed twice to Vietnam, and had command of an infantry battalion during building of the infamous Berlin Wall (1961-63). He commanded an Airborne brigade, and was Chief of Staff of the 82nd Airborne Division. He also served as a member of the General Staff, Headquarters, Department of the Army, and the Joint Chiefs of Staff, with duty as a member of the U.S. Delegation to the Military Committee of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO). Riffe retired in 1972 with 30 years of service. Military decorations include four awards of the Legion of Merit, two Bronze Stars for Valor, a Purple Heart, and the Army Commendation Medal.

After his Army years, Riffe built a civilian career first with the Federal National Mortgage Association and later with the Government Employees Insurance Company as Director of the Military Department.

Survivors include his wife Bea, three children – Tom, Eileen, Lydia and her husband Stephan - as well as five grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. A date for a full military honors service at Arlington National Cemetery is pending.



### **WOODSHOP NEWS**

Several years ago, someone donated a wall cabinet to the woodshop for storage of various materials. It was made of pressed board coated with melamine. Over the years, it had begun to fall apart and needed to be replaced. So, HH Woodworkers Group decided to make a new cabinet and use the process of making it a lesson in cabinet making for 2-3 WWG members.

The class was conducted by Paul White with the assistance of Andy Johnson, both experienced woodworkers. The students were Charles Wood, Barbara Bernard, and Steve Young.

Paul designed the cabinet and drew up a set of plans. Rough-cut cherry lumber was purchased for \$35.00, and the students used the jointer, thickness planer, and table saw to mill the lumber into finished boards.

The class learned how to inspect the wood and select the best pieces for the various parts of the cabinet. Following Paul's plan, the students were taught how to make tenon and mortise joints for the face frame, sides and doors of the cabinet, using the table router, appropriate router bits, and a specialized jig. The class then glued and clamped the pieces together and assembled the cabinet. Notably, no screws or nails were used in the construction of the cabinet, as the students learned that tight joinery and careful gluing were sufficient. Sanding, staining, and finishing were the final lessons. The finished cabinet is pictured below with cabinet making students Charles Wood and Barbara Bernard.

His career was with the U.S. Army, but he always maintained an interest in carpentry and woodworking. He continues his interest today as the leader of the Woodworking Club at HH.






