Are You Receiving Community Updates?

DECEMBER BOARD BRIEFS

As we look forward to the Holidays and the New Year, the Board is still wrapping up as much business as we can to be prepared for 2025. First off, we have our Annual Meeting on December 3rd from 3-5pm in the Clubhouse Ballroom. This year we will broadcast the meeting, record it and rebroadcast so everyone can get a chance to view it. We will still have in-person voting December 3rd, so those who did not vote via proxy or electronically can vote for the candidates of their choice that day. We plan to announce the winners Wednesday, December 4th by 5pm.

Several of our Committees and the Board will meet in December to select their 2025 officers. The Board plans to do that December 5 at 10am in the Mt. View Room. These are open meetings and will be announced via E-Comm as well as on our Website calendar; do plan to attend and if there are still openings on a Committee, consider volunteering to assist.

We still have several ongoing issues that we hope are resolved or will be resolved in early 2025. One of these is the Prince William Water Pump Station/24" force main line project that should be wrapped up in January 2025. PWW and the Community both would like this done as soon as possible so we can start on road repair.

We also have the ongoing issue with the Department of Justice on a Civil Investigation into the Paycheck Protection Plan that we applied for, received to assist the staff from UTP that worked in our facilities and that was forgiven in 2021. We are working closely with our management company, our insurance agent and our lawyers to bring resolution to this issue as quickly as possible and with the best interests of the Association in mind.

And with that said, I need to thank all the Boards and Committees I have worked with over the past 16 years as I will be retiring on 12/3/2024. I started in 2008 on Grounds and then went to the Board in 2013. It has been an honor and a privilege to have served the Heritage Hunt community for 16 yrs. I admire and appreciate all the efforts of the Board and Committee volunteers I have worked with and I know they will continue to serve the community well.

SO for me, one last time, the following resolutions were reviewed at the October 24, 2024 Board meeting. Due to Horn publication dates they appear here a month late. For a faster update they will be on the website with the Board Minutes within 2 weeks of any meeting.

- Approved Brother's Paving and Concrete to do needed concrete repairs in our common areas in an amount NTE \$10.000 from the infrastructure Reserve.
- Approved a contract with DMV Chimney for repairs to the 6 chimneys in the Marsh Mansion in the amount of \$12,500 from Repair and Replacement Reserves.
- Approved a contact with VA Striping in the amount of \$9,750 to address the faded lines between the Front Gate and the Fitness Center. The funding to come from operations.
- Approved a contract to engaged Rees Broome PC to file the necessary documents relating to the Corporate Transparency Act on behalf of the Association in the amount of \$375 from operations.
- Approved the publication of the 2025 Design Guidelines and Residential Maintenance Standards November 1, 2024.
- Approved funding for the replacement of the Mt. View Room and Ballroom Shure Audio mixers to AVI (sole source allowed) in the amount of NTE \$48,084 from Reserves and as unfunded 2024 of \$42,417.

2024 ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTION

Eligibility to Vote:

- 2) Proxy Ballot Paper Ballots and a Proxy Envelope are included in the Annual Meeting Notice. To vote via Proxy Ballot, simply complete the ballot, detach from the notice and insert in the envelope provided. Submit the envelope to the Clubhouse Front Desk or the Marsh Mansion HOA office, no later than Monday, December 2 at 5:00 pm. You must sign the envelope and have your signature witnessed.
- 3) In Person at the Annual Meeting –
 Registration will open at 2:00 pm on
 Tuesday, December 3 prior to the
 meeting Call to Order at 3:00 pm. To
 register, go to the Registration Table where
 you will be given a voting packet; if you did
 not vote online or via Proxy Ballot. Place
 your completed ballot in the ballot box prior
 to the beginning of the meeting or during
 the meeting when the vote is called.

There will be no Floor Nominations or Write-In Candidates on the ballot at the Annual Meeting.


2025 RESIDENT DIRECTORY

PEARL HARBOR DECEMBER 7, 1941

BY SUSIE PARKER



Because I was just over a year old, I am relying on my mother's memories of our experience that fateful day as well as our evacuation. I also have personal letters and official mail from the U.S. Navy detailing what took place.

In June 1941, our family of four that included my mother, father, my sister, who was 2 ½, and myself, moved into a tiny bungalow between Waikiki beach and the foot of Diamond Head, the extinct volcano, in Honolulu. My father, a young naval officer, had been given his choice between two ships on which to serve. He chose the USS Portland which was a heavy cruiser. It turned out to be a good decision as the other choice was anchored in Pearl Harbor at the time of the Japanese attack, and the USS Portland was two days out of port on the way to Midway Island.



The Sunday morning of the attack, my mother was taking my sister and me for a walk in a large baby carriage when she heard a loud noise. She looked up and saw planes overhead. She could not actually see Pearl Harbor or Hickham Field as they were some distance away but quickly realized what was happening and returned home. Shortly afterwards, MPs arrived and took us up to tunnels in the base of Diamond Head where we stayed for several days. The military and government fully expected the Japanese bombers to return. It was well known by residents of the island in prior weeks that "something was up" because many

Japanese residents had been leaving the island. My sister was recovering from exploratory brain surgery and had a Japanese amah who helped my mother as neither of us girls was walking. Yuriko told my mother during that time "If I don't come back someday it's not because I don't like you."

After we returned to the bungalow, a neighbor who knew we were alone invited us to stay with her. The following is an excerpt from the first letter my mother sent to my father after the bombing: "I was never so grateful for anything as to your being at sea when this business hit. Don't worry about us, we are much to stubborn to ever pass out along the way." Then began the wait for evacuation. Most dependents were to be sent back to the mainland on cruise ships but it was a long, hard trip. The Army wanted evacuations to begin immediately, but the Navy wanted to wait until ships were available to escort the cruise ships as they were apprehensive that Japanese submarines might be patrolling the waters between Hawaii and the mainland.

PanAm Clipper airplanes were commandeered to fly persons with health issues as the long trip by ship would be hazardous to those with medical conditions. My sister's doctor wrote a letter to the officer in charge of choosing those that qualified for evacuation by air stating that she most likely would not survive the trip by ship due to her recent surgery. Apparently, there was considerable animosity among evacuees as to who was eligible for the flights.

My mother, sister, and I were required to gather early in the morning each day at the airport beginning December 20 and wait for our names to be called. If our names were not called, we returned home in the evening and repeated the process the next day. Finally, on December 23rd we were allowed on board. All seats had been removed from the plane down to the bare metal floor. There was no food, water, or blankets provided so we had to bring anything we needed. We were returning to San Diego on the eighteen-hour flight. Luckily, my grandmother lived there. If we had been required to take the next ship leaving for the mainland, the Lurline, it would have been a trip of more than a week as it got lost on the way. My mother was very grateful to the doctor who helped us return by air.

Prior to our evacuation, there was no time to arrange for moving our belongings back to the U.S. The lady who took us in when we returned from

Diamond Head a few days after the attack was able to arrange for a flat-bed truck to come and get our things. As we left the house for the air field, all my mother saw was everything being thrown on the truck. She thought that was the last she would ever see of them. I don't suppose there were a lot of things, but they were all our worldly goods. About three months later we were living in a rented house in San Diego, and the doorbell rang. My mother went to the front door and a delivery man announced he had our belongings. Everything was actually packed in teakwood boxes. There was no breakage and nothing was missing. My mother said it was the best military move we ever made.



In 2010, George and I celebrated our 50th wedding anniversary by taking a cruise to the Hawaiian Islands. We wanted to see if we could find the little bungalow my family lived in on Pearl Harbor Day. I had no address as all mail at that time was APO. I decided to contact the library in

Honolulu to ask if they had old city telephone books for that time frame. They replied they did but didn't have a listing for my family's name. Several weeks later it occurred to me that maybe in 1941 the Diamond Head area was in the county. I contacted the library again for telephone books for areas outside the city and BINGO they found the address. While our cruise ship was docked in Honolulu, we took a taxi and found the tiny bungalow. The earlier picture shows the way it looks now with several additions. I was able to stand in the same small garden where this picture of Yuriko and me was taken in 1941. I also learned that the modest home we rented is still in a neighborhood of modest homes that now are worth millions.

I recently found a very interesting book, Safe Passage by James F. Lee, about this time period and more about the evacuation. One fact I learned from the book is that it took over a year to evacuate all those wanting to return to the U.S.

WINTERIZING YOUR HOSE BIBBS

OK – so what's a hose bibb and why should I winterize it?

- · Your hose bibb is an outside water faucet.
- Because it is outside, it and the exterior piping that leads to the inside of the building are subject to freezing which can lead to a quite expensive plumbing and, if left unrepaired long enough, structural damage to the home.

OK – so how do I do it?

On the inside of your house, in an area where there is exposed plumbing nearest to the exterior hose bibb there is a cut-off valve. In my home, a 1-1/2 floor Danbury without a basement, the cut-off valves are in the utility room and the master bath. Yours may be in another location.



My utility room cut-off valve looks like the image here. It is near the hot-water heater.

If you have a basement, at least one and perhaps two of the cut-off valves are in the basement.

The first thing you do to winterize is to shut off the water from inside

the house using the cut-off valve. The old saying "Righty tightly- lefty loosie" is true. Turn the knob clockwise (to the right) and you will turn off the outside water.

Go outside and turn on the hose bibb to check – if no water comes out you've done it correctly – if water comes out, try again. Turn the hose bibb off again.

Now that the water is turned off in both places it is time to purge the standing water from the system. Look for the relief knob (sometimes called a cap) on the cut-off valve. Mine looks like the image in the next column. It is on top of my cut-off valve.

Loosen the cap (remember lefty loosie) by turning the cap counterclockwise.



If the cap has a hole in it, loosen it about three turns.

Now go to the outside hose bib and open it all the way (lefty). If the hose bib is inside the

garage you might want to place a bucket or pan under it to catch the fluid that will drain out.

When that bibb is drained shut it, return to the inside turn-off valve and tighten the cap finger tight. If nothing comes out you should completely remove the cap on the shut-off valve on the inside

If there is no hole in the cap you will have to remove the cap all the way.



Be careful not to remove or lose the black 0-Ring inside of the cap. They are hard to replace and you don't want to end up with a \$500 dollar replacement of the entire apparatus

because you lost a 5-cent 0-ring. The image here shows the 0-ring.



In my Danbury, there is a rear hose bibb. The shut-off is under the sink nearest the windows in the Master Bath. The image on the left shows what it looks like. The red knob and relief cap on the shut-off valve are visable in the image.

In this one, you must clean out the area under the cut-off valve and put a pan or container under the cut-off valve. The residual water WILL drain into the area under the sink.

The cap in this case is on the side of the cut-off valve.

Go through the same steps

- Shut off the cut-off valve (clockwise-righty).
- · Go outside and shut off hose bibb
- Go inside and remove the cap. CAREFUL Don't lose the 0-ring
- · Go outside and open the hose bibb
- Wait about 5 minutes
- Close the hose bibb
- Go inside and replace the cap and screw it finger tight
- Clean up the water that missed the pan in my case, the initial water is under pressure and usually misses the pan. A grunge towel comes in handy.

You may want to purchase protective covers for the outside hose bibs. They are cheap and, with proper draining of your hose bibb, you will have double protection.

Enjoy your house this winter.



EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

WHAT WE DID IN 2024, WHAT WE HAVE PLANNED FOR 2025

The Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) continues to keep the Heritage Hunt residents safe as we prepare for not only the major events that can impact us all, but also prepare residents for those medical emergencies in the home. The EPC knows how important communications are in an emergency, this year major storms took out communications for extended period across the

States. Our
residents,
being seniors,
depend on
having quick
access to our
First
Responders.
Therefore,
using the

strong relationship with the Heritage Hunt Ham Radio Club and our Emergency Volunteers (EVs), we are prepared to maintain our communications with Emergency Services when home and cell phones fail. A major accomplishment this year was developing a Heritage Hunt Emergency Response Map showing street addresses, not lot numbers. This allows Zone Directors, such as Rich Tricarico for South Zone shown here with the Map, to quickly locate where one of his EVs reports an emergency. The Heritage Hunt Map showing our Zones is on the HH website under Member Home.



So how do we prepare for those medical emergencies in the home? This year we trained 43 residents through our

quarterly Hands-Only Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) courses. Pictured, Neil Kelly and Mae Mather provide training to residents using our Rescue Mannequins and practice Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). In 2025, we will continue to provide regular CPR and other health and safety training, for details and schedule, send a message to cprhhepc@gmail.com.

So, what do we have planned for 2025? The HOA Board recently approved our Resolution for T-Comm. This system allows all residents to be contacted within a few minutes by home and cell phones. Although T-Comm has been available for several years, with the approval of the Resolution, EPC will be working with the HOA Board and CAMP to implement procedures and pre-set messages for making these emergency notifications by CAMP during business hour and by the Board/EPC after hours. Another initiative will be strengthening the link with County Emergency Services. The Prince William County Amateur Radio Emergency Services (ARES) Director has been in contact with our Ham Radio Club. In the news on the recent devastating hurricanes, we learned Volunteers for ARES played a key role in establishing communications in these Southern States. Therefore, EPC will be working with this Director as we better define how we will draw support from ARES during loss of normal communications and possible how we can provide support to ARES. If you are interested in obtaining a Ham license, or if licensed participating at Heritage Hunt, the Ham Radio Club can be found at https://www.heritagehunt. net/member-home/heritage-hunt-hams.

As always, we need volunteers to be ready when an emergency occurs to protect the health and safety of our residents. You can contact EPC to volunteer, or for details on the safety and health programs we provide, at emergencypreparedness@heritagehunt.net.

So, until next year: Be Safe – Be Prepared – Be Vigilant.

These fun-filled holiday celebrations were shared by Americans of various backgrounds.

This book shows how Christmas as currently celebrated needs to be seen through the prism of the Civil War and subsequent vast changes in America – civic, scientific, economic, social, and ethnic. Regardless of our ethnic and religious backgrounds, Christmas in America will be enjoyed by anyone who would like to have a better understanding of how our country's observance of Christmas arose. Also, after reading the book, we can tell our descendants how our families' various holiday celebrations evolved in America.

If you cannot find the book in a library, it can be ordered from AbeBooks.com. This softcover tome, published by Oxford University Press, New York, 1995, contains 11 chapters, plus notes and an index – 219 pages total.

RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT

HERITAGE HUNT RESIDENT WINS FIVE GOLD MEDALS IN NORTHERN VIRGINIA SENIOR OLYMPICS!



Heritage Hunt resident Priscilla Knight won five gold medals at the Northern Virginia Senior Olympics (NVSO) at the Dulles South Recreation and Community Center on Sept. 20. Knight swam the 50-, 100-, and 900-yard freestyle, and the 50- and 100-yard backstroke with women in her age group.

"I swam a lot slower than I did as a teenager training for the international Olympics," Knight says. "Back then, we got up at 4 a.m. to train before school, then again after school. I had wet hair much of the day. Swimming an hour at our Heritage Hunt pools without a coach wasn't nearly as intense.

NVSO started in 1982. It allows people age 50 and up to compete in swimming, track and field, tennis, pickleball, racquetball, table tennis, Wii bowling, bocce, badminton, basketball, cycling, golf, etc. Seniors who prefer less strenuous activities compete in croquet, billiards, cornhole toss, jigsaw puzzles, scrabble, Sudoku, Dominos, Mah Jongg, horseshoe toss, etc. NVSO's motto is Living Healthy Longer.

"Registering for the Senior Olympics made me get in the pool and train. But some days I preferred talking to Heritage Hunt folks in the outdoor pool. At our ages, we can compromise."

Knight's middle son, Eric Knight, set a number of records and competed in several Olympic trials. "Today's swimmers train on a much higher level than when I was young," Eric's mother explains. "My son swam eight hours a day when he wasn't consuming dozens of eggs, boxes of lasagna, and gallons of milk each week. That boy could eat!"

Knight encourages Heritage Hunt residents to stay as active as they can. "Pick a sport or activity and compete – just for the fun of it," Knight says. "You'll meet interesting people, and your children will give you high fives. Trust me, you don't have to look good in a bathing suit or track shorts. Those days are gone!"




