FEBRUARY BOARD BRIEFS

WELCOME TO FEBRUARY!

Here's the good news! Heritage Hunt was nominated again by Virginia Living Magazine's Best of Virginia. Our community was nominated in the categories: Best Golf Course; Best Retirement Community; Best Charity Event: Heritage Charity Classic, and a couple of other categories. Voting ended January 31. Keep your fingers crossed for more "Best of" awards for Heritage Hunt Golf and Country Club.

Prince William Water (PWW) continues its work on the force main and pumphouse project. The frigid temperatures and snow in January slowed progress on completing the project. Demolition of the old pumphouse is scheduled to begin this month. The Board will get an update from PWW the first week in February.

There is no new news to report on the Civil Investigative Demand by the Department of Justice related to Paycheck Protection Program loan.

Landscapes Golf Management (LGM) hit the ground running in January. Joe Goellner was on site several times during the month to orient golf operations and golf course maintenance staff to LGM. He also set up an open meeting to introduce Bryce Juedes, Chief Financial Officer Landscapes Unlimited. In addition to seeing the facility and meeting the team, Bryce sat with Board and Committee members to talk about Equipment Fleet Management for golf course operations, and more specifically about potential leasing of some of our golf equipment that meet our financial and operational needs.

Be sure to sign up for two special events in February brought to us by CulinArt. A romantic evening with candlelight and flowers is in the offing for Valentine's Day on Friday, February 14 in the Red Oak Bar and Grill. Curbside Valentine's menu will also be available. A rockin' 1950's Sock Hop is scheduled on February 22 in the Great Oak Ballroom. Watch for the return of Sunday Brunch in the ROBG this month. The official announcement will be made in What's Cookin' soon.

In the next few weeks, the Board plans to convene informational town halls that will be open

to all residents on 2 major projects: repair and replacement of HH roads and repair of the indoor pool ceiling. The roads project is a complicated one and will affect the entire community over the course of 2-3 years. The Board, together with CAMP and the Grounds Committee, will organize the town hall so residents can learn about details of the project and ask questions. The repair of the indoor pool ceiling is another major project with many moving parts. Residents are encouraged to attend this town hall to understand the details of this project and ask questions. The town halls will probably be held in the Great Oak Ballroom to accommodate the number of residents who wish to attend. Stay tuned for details to be announced in the e-Communicator.

You may have noticed that a major (25%) portion of your monthly assessment funds the Reserves. Last fall, the Board commissioned a Reserve Study by Building Reserves Inc (BRI). In the next couple of weeks, the Board, Committees, CAMP, CulinArt, and LGM will review the study and request updates, as needed.

Don't forget, Groundhog Day is February 2nd. Let's hope Punxsutawney Phil doesn't see his shadow for the sake of our snow removal budget.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY: USE SITUATIONAL AWARENESS; BE CAREFUL OUT THERE

The Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) has resident safety as our number one goal, but we need your help. Situational Awareness, always expect the unexpected especially when walking near or across the streets of Heritage Hunt. Although Prince William Water's work on Heritage Hunt Drive has been completed, painting the lines and crosswalks remains a challenge until Heritage Hunt Drive is refinished in the future and permanent lines and crosswalk marking have been applied. So, in the interim use your situational awareness. Remember, even though once a pedestrian steps onto the crosswalk, Virginia traffic laws require the driver to stop until the pedestrian has exited the crosswalk (not until the pedestrian is halfway across), you still need to use your awareness to ensure the driver has seen you before you leave the curb.



For your safety, there is only one crosswalk at Ryton Ridge as well as Walnut Hill crossing Heritage Hunt Drive. Therefore, at Ryton Ridge, use the north side of Ryton

Ridge since it connects directly to the sidewalk that leads to the tennis courts and the fitness center. As shown in the photo, this increases your safety by not crossing on the south side of Ryton Ridge that has no crosswalk and requires crossing the fitness center entry driveway and/or the parking area to get to either the tennis courts or the fitness center. Use your situational awareness to realize this Ryton Ridge/Heritage Hunt Drive intersection confuses drivers with the traffic configuration going between single to divided lanes. So, for your safety use the north side crosswalk, since this crosswalk being downhill and therefore farthest from the divided lanes increases your visibility to drivers.

Although we are months away from Summer, even in the cold of Winter, residents still park along the East Side of Heritage Hunt Drive when using the Club House and fitness center. Winter darkness also impacts your visibility to drivers, so always



wear light color clothing. When going to the Clubhouse, the crosswalk at Arthur Hills Drive, being a four-way stop, provides an extra level of safety. When going to the fitness center, and in Summer the outdoor pool, the north side crosswalk at Ryton Ridge provides a far safer means of crossing than darting out from the trees along the Heritage Hunt Drive center island. Also, by using the crosswalks, you have an excellent way to demonstrate pedestrian safety to your young family members as you head to the pool.

So be safe when walking about Heritage Hunt, and please consider helping us in making resident safety our number one goal by joining us. Contact the Emergency Preparedness Committee for details on the safety and health programs we provide at emergencypreparedness@heritagehunt. net. As always, we need volunteers so we can be ready when an emergency occurs in order to protect the health and safety of our residents.

GARDEN CLUB

With the cold temperatures outside, the Garden Club of HH extends warm wishes to all!

We can now focus on our indoor plants plus those we have brought in from our decks and patios for the season. Here are some tips for the winter.

1. Cut back on watering. Less sunlight means less water needed. It's a sleepy time for plants. Water thoroughly, but less often.

2. Don't worry if a few leaves drop. This is normal as they adjust to less light.

3. Since most houseplants rest in winter, they don't require fertilizer. Resume in early spring.

4. Resist the urge to repot. Save that for the growth time of spring.

5. Ramp up the humidity, since heated homes dry the indoor air. Use a humidifier or place your plants on trays filled with pebbles and water. Don't overwater the plant itself.

We hope you fill your home with the natural beauty of plants and enjoy them throughout the winter months.

GENEALOGY CLUB



The Genealogy Club will meet on Monday, Feb. 24, at 2 PM in the Mountain View Room of our Clubhouse. Our speaker will be Kevin Garcia, who will talk about the Jacobites who were sent to the colonies as

punishment from the King of England, how they got here, and where they settled. This topic will help shed light on ancestors who were affected by the Jacobite rebellions of 1715 and 1745.

Kevin is a 20-year Navy veteran who owns "Diversity in Me," a genealogy company, and is the founder of the Western Prince William Genealogy Club. In addition, he is a member of the National Genealogical Society, the Virginia Genealogical Society, the Virginia Genealogical Society, and the Association of Professional Genealogists.

Have you ever wondered how your ancestors were educated and what kind of textbooks they used in school? A collection of old "McGuffey Readers" and other "ancient" textbooks which family members had used during their long, long ago school days came into my possession when I discovered a large box of old textbooks in my grandparents' attic. One in particular caught my attention because of the disparity between books from the late 19th century and the era during which we, here in Heritage Hunt, were in school. Titled Historical Atlas, it was packed with countless very intricate maps (including the Roman Forum and other ancient sites worldwide throughout the centuries), followed by an incredibly long index.

Leafing through the pages, I paused to reflect on how important education is to human development, but no high school today would dare offer students that "atlas" to master! However, the positive side of finding old textbooks is that they shed light on our ancestors' school days and helped shape their way of thinking. Such books can be useful additions to our collections of ancestral artifacts as we try to bring our forebears to life and have a better understanding of their lives, attitudes, and choices they made throughout their lives.





WOODWORKING CLUB

WEDNESDAYS AT THE WOODSHOP

It has been noted that some HH residents who took the Basic Woodworking class have never returned to work on projects. When asked why, they said they had trouble understanding the steps necessary to complete a project and remembering how to set up and operate the machines. Others came to the woodshop, but they demonstrated that they needed assistance. So, six members of the WWG have volunteered to have one of the six at the woodshop each Wednesday afternoon beginning at 1:00 PM to assist residents who have completed machine orientation or Basic Woodworking and currently have key card access to the woodshop but feel they need assistance.

HH residents who wish to be oriented so they can use various woodshop machines may contact one of the following HH residents (shown below). These same residents can also provide a tour of the woodshop. Additional information can be obtained by attending a Woodworking Group (WWG) meeting held at 2:30 PM on the second Thursday of the month in the Clubhouse Mt. View Room.

As stated in HH Administrative Resolution #35; to be authorized to be present alone and without supervision or assistance in the Heritage Hunt Woodworking Shop, you must be a resident of Heritage Hunt who is at least 18 years of age, and you must complete the following actions.

• Obtain an orientation package from the Clubhouse Front Desk.

• Read the Heritage Hunt Administrative Policy Resolution #35 (AR #35).

• Read, complete, and sign a Disclaimer, Waiver, Release, and Indemnification Agreement (Appendix 1 of AR #35) which limits Heritage Hunt HOA liability and outlines the specific machines that may be used after you have been oriented.

• Read and sign a copy of the Heritage Hunt Woodworking Shop Safety Rules (Appendix 2 of AR #35). • Read and sign a copy of the Heritage Hunt Woodworking Shop Responsibilities of Users (Appendix 3 of AR #35).

• Read and sign a copy of the Shop Operation / Safety Check Sheet for each machine you have initialed on the Disclaimer, Waiver, Release, and Indemnification Agreement.

• Demonstrate to one of the orienters listed that you are competent to set up and safely use the machines you initialed on the Disclaimer, Waiver, Release, and Indemnification Agreement.

• Turn in at the Clubhouse Front Desk a signed copy of Appendices 1, 2, and 3 of AR #35 and a signed copy of the Shop Operation/Safety Check Sheets for all machines you have initialed on the Disclaimer, Waiver, Release, and Indemnification Agreement and maintain a copy for your personal records.

• Update your Heritage Hunt ID card at the Clubhouse Front Desk to operate the woodshop entry lock.

THE SERENDIPITOUS ORIGIN OF 55+ COMMUNITIES

Heritage Hunt residents enjoy a nicely unique lifestyle. It may surprise residents to learn 55+ communities were created in 1988 by Congress in an effort to expand housing opportunities for families with children. Huh? Families with children?

In the 1970's, apartment developers and property managers figured out children and adolescents often created a multitude of property management problems. Toys left in the common areas, vandalism and inadequate after school supervision, just to mention a few. Many apartment complexes began adopting "adults only" restrictions. The lowest allowable age limits would range from 35-50 with specific "no children allowed" rules.

The growth of "adult only" apartment complexes, especially in California, produced a serious shortage of housing available for families with children. As a result, family advocate groups began efforts to expand federal fair housing discrimination laws to include "families with children". A term called familial discrimination.

The original 1968 federal fair housing law outlawed housing discrimination based on race, religion, national origin and sex. In the mid-1980's, advocacy groups supported new legislations to expand the law to protect families with children. The legislation received multiple hearings but was vigorously opposed by realtors, apartment owners and the Reagan Administration. Many U.S. Representatives and Senators did not want to use political energy to pass a bill doomed to be vetoed by President Reagan. Additionally. "adult only" housing complexes were hugely popular and some politicians worried about being criticized for outlawing them. Things changed overnight in August 1988 when President Reagan dropped his opposition to the legislation.

Why would Reagan change positions? He did so at the request of some real estate companies who were worried Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis would be the next President. Vice President Bush was badly behind in the polls. Some lobbying groups knew if Dukakis won, the legislation would pass in 1989 with very little negotiation. The strategy was to cut a deal while Reagan was still President.

The popularity of "adult only" housing communities was especially true of Mobile Home Communities in Florida. Today they prefer to be called "Manufactured Housing Communities". The homes are only "mobile" when moved from the factory to the community. Once sited, they are rarely moved again. These communities were intentionally dense with small homes and were never designed for families with children. No playgrounds and no school bus services. The thought of opening these communities to families with children sent shock waves through Florida community owners. Almost overnight phone calls skyrocketed to every Florida Senator and Representative pleading for help.

No one had anticipated the grassroots opposition to the legislation. Senior citizens in Florida were very opposed to having their lifestyle upended. Several Florida Members of Congress began searching for a potential compromise and the concept of allowing "regulated senior communities" emerged. The goal was to allow "senior" communities to exist but they had to be truly "senior" and not just "adult only" communities.

The first task was to define "senior". How old does someone have to be considered "senior"? The family advocates wanted to make the exemption narrow and suggested "60 and older". The landlords wanted 50 and older. Voila, the compromise was 55. Nothing magical about "55". It was just a split the difference compromise. President Reagan signed the bill into law on September 13, 1988.

An important element of the 1988 law is "proactive" enforcement. Communities like Heritage Hunt must make sure every residence is owned (or occupied) by a person 55 or older. Many communities do annual "age" audits to verify compliance. There is some very limited "wiggle room" but it must be used judiciously. For example, what if a spouse (age 53) loses a spouse over 55? Does the 53 year old have to sell and move out? Maybe. It is a gray area requiring Heritage Hunt management to make the decision based on how many other age exemptions have been granted. Allowing too many age exemptions is risky and could result in fair housing compliance litigation, a costly peril. Age exemptions should never be granted just because a resident wants to sell to a person under 55.

Hopefully you have found this story interesting. I have several reasons for writing this article. First and foremost I want to keep my aging brain active and writing helps. Secondly, I was only 38 years old in 1988 working as a lobbyist on the 55+ legislation. Most of the other lobbyists were easily 10 years older than me. Not many of us left to tell the story and I thought it would be of interest to Heritage Hunt residents who enjoy our unique "senior community" lifestyle.




