

Reserve Budgets which includes a monthly assessment fee of \$380.


• Approved a new three year contact with American Disposal Service (Trash and Recycle hauler).

CROSSROADS CONNECTION

Happy New Year! Happiness is not easily obtained without feelings of joy, contentment, and positivity. We want our lives to have meaning and value. A way to pursue happiness is to serve our communities.

Food insecurity continues to challenge children who are eligible for free school breakfast and lunch but are short on meals for the weekend. Parents communicate anonymously with social workers and school counselors to communicate their children's food insecurity. Crossroads assures that these children have weekend food to take home.

Crossroads had its beginning in Heritage Hunt when one family took the lead in supplying food and volunteered their home for ten years to food storage, packing, and delivery. When the local needs expanded, Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church's volunteers moved all remaining food to their Haymarket church building early 2020. Schools were closed so parents stayed in their cars for a no-contact service. I remember the feeling of joy, contentment and positivity. I was happy! Those I worked with were also in good spirits as they felt a sense of purpose, especially during the pandemic.



Crossroads Connection continues to serve the community. On Saturday, December 9, 2023 we collected food and handed out informational flyers in Haymarket. Mayor Ken Luersen of Havmarket. pictured here with our high-energy

As encouraged by Sentara, Crossroads is reaching out to partner with the other organizations that address food insecurity, and with representatives from health and wellness charities.





DIGITAL GATEWAY THREATENS HH FUTURE

AN INVITATION TO SUPPORT THE HH CHALLENGE TO THE PRINCE WILLIAM DIGITAL GATEWAY INDUSTRIAL DATA CENTER PROJECT - LARGEST IN THE WORLD

Dear HH resident: Industrial data centers (buildings, power lines and new roads) are being planned all around the edges of our beautiful community.

On December 13, four of the eight members and one abstention of the PW County Board voted to approve the rezoning applications from QTS and Compass Data Centers and pave the way for a massive 2,000-acre industrial area along our eastern border.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

MEET YOUR 2024 EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

The Heritage Hunt Homeowner's Association voting has been completed, and the Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) is pleased to announce we now have a full Committee, as shown in the photograph of the 2024 Committee. Over the past several years we have not had all seven positions filled on the Committee.



For 2024, this has been rectified, and the Committee now welcomes Sam Bresler, Christina Johnson, Paul Kaufman, and Robert Stepien.

They are joining John Busavage, Vic Crawford, and Al Grimmig on the Committee, which will continue to receive support from our Zone Directors, Emergency Volunteers (EVs), our safety and health training volunteers/managers, and the volunteers from the Heritage Hunt Ham club.

All those on the Committee and our many volunteers will be continuing to ensure Heritage Hunt can weather the storms we must withstand, possibly on our own, as the County manages an area wide event. Several past articles in the Horn have discussed how the EPC prepares for areawide emergencies, as we prepare for the worst and hope for the best. The Committee, now at full complement, will continue to be prepared as we reach out to other Committees, CAMP and UTP, and Prince William County Emergency Services to ensure an integrated and coordinated response to keep us all healthy and safe.

As an example, in coordination with the Grounds Committee, the EPC has asked VDOT to correct a dangerous situation at the intersection of Route 29 and Heathcote Boulevard, caused by the confusion with the "U" Turn. The recent reconfiguration at the intersection no longer



allows a "U" Turn but the "Truck" sign was not removed, as shown by the No "U" Turn on the traffic lights on the right but the "Truck" sign still on the left in the photograph.

Therefore, drivers in cars believe they have a green arrow to make a "U" turn so are turning into oncoming traffic proceeding on a green signal through the righthand curve from Heathcote to southbound Route 29. Numerous residents have reported near accidents from these cars making a "U" turn without realizing oncoming traffic has the right of way.

Concurrently, EPC will continue to provide safety and health training so our residents can be prepared to manage their household emergencies before our First Responders arrive. We will continue to offer this training throughout 2024, so watch for our announcements so you will be ready to perform CPR, or Stop the Bleed, or use a Defibrillator. Remember, this training will prepare you to help save the life of a neighbor, friend, or family member in an emergency.

You will have noticed our EVs have installed stakes at fire hydrants to prevent snowplows or delivery trucks from striking them, and to also assist the fire department in locating them when hidden by heavy snow. This action, along with many others during an emergency, shows how important the role will be for our EVs. So please join us by becoming an EV. Just ask for the EV Form from the Front Desk, fill it out, and drop it off with them. We will then reach out to you on how you can help protect the health and safety of your neighbors and friends in Heritage Hunt. Finally, remember to add the T-Comm number (703) 743-2016 into all your phones as "T-Comm Heritage Hunt" so you will receive immediate alerts on an incident affecting our community.

GARDEN CLUB

HAPPY NEW YEAR, GARDENERS!

While you may be tempted to rake up those last few piles of leaves in your yard, those leaves may be essential to the survival of butterflies, moths, snails, spiders, and dozens of other tiny creatures. While the Monarch butterfly is known for its southern migration during Winter, most other butterflies and moths spend the Winter in leaf piles in different stages of egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, or adult. In cooler weather, butterflies use leaf litter to protect themselves from the cold and from predators.

Native bees and bumblebees also rely on leaf litter for protection. The mated queen will burrow an inch or two into the earth to hibernate for Winter. A pile of leaves provides extra protection from the cold elements. There are also other tiny creatures that live in the leaves: snails, spiders, beetles, worms, and millipedes that feed birds, squirrels, chipmunks, and amphibians during the Winter.

It is NOT too late to plant spring-blooming bulbs! As long as the ground is not frozen, you can get them in. Then during Winter, anticipate the bloom in Spring!

Our first Garden Club meeting of the year will be January 25 at 10:00 in Marsh Mansion. We will have a speaker from Leopold's Preserve. Looking forward to seeing everyone start out the New Year with garden aspirations!

GENEALOGY CLUB



The Genealogy Club will meet on Monday, Jan. 22, at 2 PM in the Mountain View Room. At our meetings, we welcome anyone who is interested in starting or continuing with learning about their family histories. Perhaps you've made

a New Year's resolution to explore genealogy research. Joining our club is the perfect first step in beginning to get acquainted with your ancestors – and make new friends at the same time.

At this first get-together of 2024, which will be informal, we will talk about topics such as:

• What was the most exciting discovery you've made in your family tree?

• What aspect of genealogy research has been the most difficult for you?

• How have you helped others with their research?

• What books have been the most helpful in your research?

• What websites have you used the most?

• Have you found unexpected matches or discoveries in your DNA results?

Genealogist Jim Bartlett has said that American ancestors from the colonial era are endogamous. This means that siblings from one family often married siblings from another family. If you have a family tree going back at least six generations, you may discover matches who are descended from both those initial families. I have examples of this in my own family tree, which has led to finding numerous matches who share the same families – and interesting online conversations.

A great website to explore is the Digital Public Library of America (https://dp.la). According to genealogist Gena Philibert-Ortega, this site brings together digital items from U.S. repositories, including documents, ephemera, books, periodicals, photographs, maps, etc. If you discover an item you're interested in, click on it to learn more and then click the blue button labeled "View Full Item" to see the item on the partner repository's website. This will provide more information about the item and any copyright restrictions. As genealogy researchers, we need to be alert to those restrictions. Through this site, you may be able to learn about where an ancestor lived, his occupation, organizations s/he participated in, the family's church or religion, and historical events surrounding them.

We hope to see you at our January 22nd meeting and embark on a new year of fun-filled genealogy discoveries!

PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB

WINTER PHOTOGRAPHY



Photographing winter scenes can be a breathtaking and rewarding experience. The cold and crisp air, the glistening snow and ice covered objects create

endless opportunities to capture stunning images. Whether you're in a snowy forest, a frozen lake, or a charming winter village, there are several key tips and techniques to keep in mind.

First, it's important to properly prepare yourself and your camera for the cold. Winter photography spending longer periods of time outside, so make sure to dress warmly and in layers. Remember to protect your camera too; cold temperatures can drain the battery quickly, so always carry spare batteries and keep them warm in your pockets. Additionally, condensation can occur when moving your camera between the cold outdoor and warm indoor temperatures. To prevent this, seal your camera in a plastic bag before moving indoors, allowing it to slowly adapt to the warmer temperature.

When photographing winter scenes, it's essential to pay attention to the lighting conditions. Winter light can be soft and diffused, especially during overcast days. Take advantage of this gentle light by photographing landscapes, trees, and other natural elements. Golden hours, the moments just after sunrise and before sunset, are particularly stunning during winter, as the low angle of the sun casts long and warm hues across the snow. Be ready to capture these moments, as they offer eye-catching compositions.

Contrast is another key aspect of winter photography. The bright white snow against darker elements, such as trees or buildings, can create a striking contrast that adds depth and visual interest to your images. Look for areas where the sunlight casts shadows or where the light hits the snow in unique ways. These contrasting elements can make for captivating scenes.

Composition plays a crucial role in any photograph, and winter scenes are no exception. Explore different angles and perspectives. Experiment with leading lines, such as a winding snowy road or a row of trees, to guide the viewer's eye. Incorporate elements of scale by including a person or object in the frame, emphasizing the vastness of the winter landscape. If you have an ice storm, look for the reflections and refraction of light in the ice, especially at night. Additionally, look for patterns and textures in the snow or ice, such as footprints or frost on a window.

Lastly, experiment with different camera settings and techniques. Shooting in manual mode allows you to have full control over the exposure, giving you the flexibility to capture your intent. Additionally, try using a slower shutter speed to capture falling snowflakes or ice crystals, creating a sense of motion. Alternatively, a faster shutter speed can freeze action and capture minute details in the snow or ice.



Q: HOW DO I AVOID FALLING VICTIM TO FINANCIAL SCAMS?

A: Financial scams are on the rise each year, with the holiday season being one of the most active times.

WHAT ARE 5 OF THE MOST COMMON SCAMS?

Government Impersonation Scams: These scams often involve a scammer contacting you by phone, text message, or email and claiming to be from a government agency such as the IRS, Social Security, Medicare, or the FBI.

Sweepstakes/Lottery Scams: In these scams, you will be contacted and told that you won a prize, but there is a catch. In order to claim your prize, you may be asked to provide financial information or payment under the guise of taxes and other fees.

Robocall/Phone Scams: Robocalls take advantage of technology to call thousands of phone numbers at one time, often using local area codes. These calls may sound realistic, like claiming to be from your car "warranty department" or from Amazon.

Computer Tech Support Scams: In these scams, scammers will call claiming you have a problem with your computer and ask you to pay for a solution. They will then ask to gain remote access to your computer to resolve the problem and try to steal your personal and financial information.

The Grandparent Scam: In this scam, a criminal will call a victim and pretend to be their grandchild needing help. They will then pass the phone to another scammer posing as a lawyer or police officer demanding immediate payment.




