



#### **JANUARY BOARD BRIEFS**

First, thank you to Kathy Vergano and Jerry Fisher for their service to the community over many, many years.

Second, welcome to the Board's new members, Sandra Tomlinson and Jacki Tessmer! At the December 5 meeting, I was honored to be elected Board President. My Board colleagues include Vice President Sandra Tomlinson; Secretary Sandy Painter; Treasurer Rex Giekes; Directors Michelle Clor, Robert Ruffolo, and Jacki Tessmer.

In case you missed the December 5 Board meeting, the Board Liaisons to the committees include Sandra Tomlinson (Golf); Rex Giekes (Budget and Finance, Community Relations, and Investing and Cash Management); Sandy Painter (Emergency Preparedness and Grounds); Michelle Clor (Architectural Review and Facilities); and Jacki Tessmer (Food & Beverage and LSTV).

Last fall, the Board approved the 2025-2029 Strategic Plan and presented it to the community in a town hall held on September 13. The Strategic Plan is posted on the website under the Board of Directors/BOD Files/2025-2029 Strategic Plan.

#### The 2025 Board goals are:

- 1. Develop a new community improvement plan to align with current and future needs of HH residents;
- 2. Finalize and distribute the annual audit:
- 3. Evaluate and develop an implementation plan for a new governance structure;
- 4. Evaluate monthly specific measurable KPIs (key performance indicators) for Managing Agent and our two club service partners CulinArt and Landscapes Golf Management;

Prince William Water (PWW, formerly Prince William County Service Authority [PWCSA]) notified the Board that various tests will be conducted in the next few weeks to assure there are no issues or leaks in the new force main system. Following these tests, demolition of the old pump station will begin.

We know there are challenges ahead of us. The civil investigation by the Department of Justice relative to the PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) loan is

ongoing with nothing new to report. Together with CAMP [Community Association Management Professionals] – our Managing Agent – and our Legal Counsel at Chadwick Washington Moriarty Elmore & Bunn, this new Board will work to address and resolve any issues and move forward to keep Heritage Hunt the premier active living community in Northern Virginia.

Exciting transitions are ahead this year, particularly in Club Services that include our food and beverage and golf operations. Landscapes Golf Management (LGM) starts January 1st as Heritage Hunt's new Golf Operations and Golf Course Maintenance partner. Further, in its first few months, CulinArt – our new F&B partner - continues to learn about the community, adjusting along the way to delight residents with new seasonal menus, pop-up specials, and other surprises.

CulinArt and the Food & Beverage Committee worked together to create an exciting 2025 social calendar of community-wide Resident Events. On the road(s) again! Just can't wait to get on the road(s) again! Thank you, Willy Nelson! CAMP, the Grounds Committee, and the Board will work to begin a major project to upgrade our roads. This major community-wide project is funded through the Roads Infrastructure Reserves. Watch for announcements throughout the year that could affect your neighborhood streets so you can plan accordingly.

Facilities...there's always something that needs a nip and tuck, such as keeping our pools in tiptop condition so our water-loving residents can stay in shape through water aerobics, swimming laps, or just relaxing by the outdoor pool in the summertime. #### WHEN TWO PATHS CROSS AGAIN.....



After moving to Heritage Hunt, how many of you have met someone else here that you knew in the past? Here's a story about two people who met here and realized they shared a past many years ago.

Nancy Ward, who has lived in Heritage Hunt since 2019, started playing the violin in 7th grade. After a few months, her teacher told her that she just was not particularly good with the violin, so she suggested she switch to a viola. In a brief time. Nancy became exceptionally good at playing the viola and ended up in several adult orchestras. In fact, as a senior in HS, she was offered a scholarship at the prestigious Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, to finish her senior year and begin majoring in music. Like most high school seniors, she was not about to uproot and leave her friends and family during her senior year and move to a city far away. She went into panic mode, declined the scholarship, and stopped playing the viola altogether! Nancy attended Florida State University and majored in Elementary Education and her life took off with careers and kids, and all the events that life offers young people.

When Nancy was about thirty-five, she began to think back to her music days. Something in her missed playing music, so she decided to again start playing viola. After practicing intentionally again, she auditioned for an orchestra, and since they needed viola players, she was asked to join. But after a short time, Nancy's life with children and career took most of her time, and the viola took a back seat.

Moving on to 2009 when Nancy retired, she had two grandchildren and wanted to get them interested in music. She figured if she started the guitar, they might be more interested in guitar than viola, so Nancy learned to play the guitar, and recently one grandson finally took up the guitar.

After moving to Heritage Hunt, Nancy joined the Architectural Review Committee. One day she was tasked to go and approve a remodeling project. When she arrived and met the owner, the woman kept saying, "You look familiar", but could not place her. Neither woman thought more about it, but Chelle Fulk never stopped wondering where she had met Nancy.

A small group of Heritage Hunt amateur musicians decided to have a meeting and see what interest there was in forming music groups who would like to play together. There, Nancy met Joe Logatto, Paul Procopio, and Eve Brandon. Nancy decided to practice her guitar with Paul's piano, and Joe Logatto electric guitar hoping to perform for the music group in the future. The music group kept meeting with Eve Brandon taking the lead, and more people began to join. At one meeting, Chelle Fulk, a professional violin and viola player here in Heritage Hunt, joined the group. She began playing with Nancy and Paul, adding a violin to their instruments. One day, Nancy mentioned that she used to play the viola, and that she played in the McClean Orchestra about 30 years ago. Chelle was surprised and said she had also played in that orchestra around then as well. Chelle went home and browsed through old programs she had saved, and sure enough, there were both of their names in the program! They had crossed paths together in that same orchestra!

Chelle then encouraged Nancy to take up the viola again and loaned her one to practice with. Nancy began, and like learning to ride a bicycle, the viola came back to her after much practice. Chelle kept encouraging Nancy to practice and then loaned her a viola as well. Today, Nancy owns two 5-string violins, 1 viola and 4 guitars. Nancy is part of the "In Betweens," a trio with Joe Logatto and Dave Anderson, and performs frequently with many other amateur musicians in the community. You have probably seen her more than once at various performances. Nancy credits Chelle with encouraging her, coaching her, and providing opportunities for her to excel in her music. We at Heritage Hunt are incredibly grateful that this duo met up again, later in life and began another musical career. Thank you both Chelle and Nancy for gracing our lives with the pleasure of music!

# **GET TO KNOW YOUR 2025 COMMITTEES ...**

#### ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) processes Design Review Applications (DRAs) submitted by homeowners wishing to make changes to the exterior of their homes and yards. When a homeowner submits a DRA to make a change such as planting a tree or adding a screened-in porch, an ARC member will review it to ensure that it complies with the Design Guidelines (DGs).

It is important to note that ARC members are not involved in the annual inspection process and do not cite homeowners for DG violations—that responsibility falls on the Covenants Administrator.

The Architectural Review Committee meets twice a month at 9:00 a.m. on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of every month except November and December when only one meeting is held. ARC members are assigned DRAs (usually 1-3) and are responsible for reviewing the information submitted, contacting the homeowner, and visiting the home to see firsthand what is proposed. The results are then presented to the rest of the committee for discussion and disposition (usually approval). New members are provided with training and typically shadow other members until they are ready to fly solo.

ARC members not only help their neighbors get their projects approved, but they also are critical in ensuring that our neighborhood retains its unique and well-kept appearance. 

# LSTV CORNER

When I attend our LSTV Meetings I am struck with not only how smart this group is, but how dedicated the group is and how unique to country clubs LSTV must be. Our meetings are 99% about supporting the community, especially now that our aging equipment is making it very difficult to produce a level of quality this community has come to expect. But they/we do it week after week.

We have hearing assist aids for people who would like to get more out of the performance. At the last Little Theatre show, we handed out 15 hearing assist aids. Now more people can enjoy concerts and events.

LSTV is always looking to find new ways we can enhance the living experience at Heritage Hunt. We came up with the idea of taking short videos of all of our 60+ groups and committees and putting them somewhere our residents can easily access so that they can be watched. The goal is to get more residents out and engaged with the community.

But sometimes the groups come to us with their ideas, and we formulate the plan. For example, Woodworking came to us and asked if we would be interested in putting videos together extolling the capabilities in our woodworking shop. One of those videos would be a safety video which is paramount for working in their shop.

A little while ago Little Theater came to us to ask if we would help them create a 'behind the scenes' video of what goes into putting a performance together. # PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB

As the end of the year approaches, so does one of the most joyful and celebrated times of the year. The Heritage Hunt Photography Club extends Seasons Greetings and Happy Holidays to all members of the Heritage Hunt Community.

This time of year also presents some of the most photogenic opportunities for photography. Whether it's the glow of holiday lights, family and friends' gatherings, or winter landscapes, the season offers endless opportunities for stunning photographs. In the spirit of giving, the following are some tips, ideas and inspiration to make this a holiday season to remember through your camera lens.

- 1. Capture the warmth of holiday lights by practicing low light photography. Use a tripod for sharper shots. Use long exposures to capture the glow or beautiful light trails. Use a low ISO and large aperture to blur the background and make the lights pop.
- 2. To capture priceless moments with family and friends, don't be afraid to take candid shots.

  Observe and wait for a smile, a laugh, or even a quiet moment. Avoid using flash by using available natural light, but if necessary, bounce the flash off a ceiling or wall for a more natural look.
- 3. Snow and frost can transform ordinary scenes into magical winter wonderlands. Early mornings are perfect for capturing fresh snow and frost. Use a low ISO for a crisp image and a fast shutter speed to capture falling snow. Overexpose by 1 to 2 stops to bring out the true whites of the snow.
- 4. Also consider photos of unwrapping gifts, holiday treats such as gingerbread houses or that special recipe passed down through generations as well as the general hustle and bustle of the season.

# STORING HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

Storing holiday items doesn't have to be a seasonal nightmare. Use these steps to face it head on, so you can relax and enjoy the next season.










