JUNE BOARD BRIEFS

Welcome to summer!! We hope that June gives us the same great weather that May did and as we are really $\frac{1}{2}$ way through 2024, let's review where we are and what's coming up.

First off, we did hire CulinArt as the new Food & Beverage Service Provider. The plan is for them to start 7/1 and we are all gearing up for that date. If there will be any delays in service or certain food/ beverage areas we will notify the community and work toward a start date. CulinArt is very excited to be here and there will be a Community meeting to introduce them to Heritage Hunt residents.

As regards to the Golf amenity, the Board has a report from the Golf Course Consulting firm GGA and we are setting up an RFP to go to vendors that have been recommended to us. The current vendor UTP will be bidding but to ensure the regrassing project goes on as planned, we have set up a "bridge" contract with UTP for 6 months to make sure that the new grass, as well as all other needed golf course maintenance work and golf course play, is maintained. Updates on the golf amenity will be forthcoming as we have details to share with the community.

We did have two May focus group sessions on improving communications. We thank Mary Foster and all the volunteers for their work. A Town Hall on this topic with proposed action items is in the planning stage and a date will be announced. The meeting will be broadcast and recorded to allow more residents access to the information.

Master Plan Phase 1 parking lot expansion. We felt that we were moving along quite well on this project and could start some work this fall. However, PWC did change some guidelines within the last 2 months and if we could not start by June 30, which we were not prepared to do, then we have to go back, review what they want and see where we are. Therefore, the Board feels we should put off any start on parking lot expansion until 2025 and make sure that we comply totally with PWC codes and guidelines. What we will do as of now is, along with management and the Grounds Committee, start repaying our side roads. Our main roads will be worked on when PWCSA is totally finished with the new pump station and 24" force main work. Their plan (and our hope) is early to late August.

running with the new Website coming along. Yes there have been hiccups but that can happen. Management, Virasec (our tech support), Jonas (POS provider) and Membersfirst (website provider) are all working and will be working on any issues that arise from a changeover of systems.

So all and all we are moving along almost exactly as planned. The Board and Management will make sure that the Community is advised on the status of all these projects promptly. Questions to the Board can be sent to boardofdirectors@heritagehunt.net or come to any Board meeting and speak to us in person.

The following resolutions were reviewed at the 4/25 Board Meeting. Due to Horn publication dates, they are appearing here a month late. For a faster update check the HH website as Board minutes as minutes are posted within 2 weeks of any meeting.

• Approved added funding in the amount of \$67,000 to allow the re-plastering and other needed repair work to the outdoor pool by Continental Pools.

• Approved the write off of an uncollectable Club account in the amount of \$210.51.

• Approved revisions to Administrative Policy # 9, Procedures relative to the use of Credit Accounts by Owners and Non-Owners.

• Approved maintenance contracts to LP Roofing to do needed work on the Marsh Mansion slate and flat roofs from reserves.

• Approved maintenance work (repairs and color coating) to the Marsh Mansion Pickle ball courts by Bishop Tennis from reserves.

• Approved adjustments to the Repair and Replacement Reserves and Road Infrastructure Reserve. The changes will be used in the level 2 reserve study scheduled for this summer.

• Approved the issuance of an RFP to purchase and install a shed for the storage of medical equipment at the Golf Maintenance Building.

• Approved issuance of an RFP for additional concrete and drainage repairs at the Bocce courts.

• Approved the use of a delineated map as a guideline for mowing operations and responsibilities by the Grounds and Golf contractors.

Pool updates from the Facilities Committee for 2024

We hope you will forgive us, but due to the repairs and confusion around the pools and timing of opening, etc., Facilities has decided that it is best to postpone the promised resident survey of hours and rules until 2025, when we will have two pools to consider! The situation with only one pool available has limited our options for hours for guests under 18, as well as for all of you, but we have tried our best! CAMP requested that we end the hours for guests under 18 on the half hour, because the new lifeguards will blow the whistle and empty the pool at 45 minutes after each hour. So, you will notice that in several situations, the hours for children under 18 do end on the half hour as requested.

Ordinarily, on Monday thru Saturday, guests under 18 are welcome between 10:00 and 1:30. The Special Event on the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend has a 2-hour break in the middle of the day to allow time for the those under 18 to eat lunch on the Knoll, and then have pool time again. Other Special Hours are for guests under 18 are listed for National Holidays and other unusual circumstances, and regular Sundays are 3-5:30.

Policy Resolution 10 is where you can find the rules for using the pool. We ask you to please read them and abide by them to make using the pool pleasant for all. Rules for Timing for Music at the Pool can be found in Appendix A, item #3. It states music hours as "4:00 until closing, Monday-Saturday." However, if enough residents request more hours, the time can be expanded. The Managing Agent (CAMP) is the responsible party, and the music itself will be turned on or off by whomever is designated as responsible, in this case, the lifeguards. Please remember that saving seats and tables is against the rules. First come, first served is the policy. FINALLY: You must sign in all guests, and also remain with your guests under 18 at all times!





HOW DO WE BEAT THE HEAT SAFELY?

We begin with safety and safety begins at home. First, as you head into the heat to grill, take a few minutes to check that those fire extinguishers for your grill and in your kitchen are still in the green range. Second, as you look around outside, do you see a Knox Box mounted on your garage or front door? No, been putting off getting a Knox Box. Now's the time to grab that Knox Box flier at the front desk and learn how to order one so that First Responders can reach you quickly when a heat related medical emergency leaves you incapacitated.

Speaking of our First Responders, how do we thank them? By inviting all three shifts to join us for brunch. Heritage Hunt was able to show our



appreciation to each of the shifts during the last few months. So once again we got to view their respond equipment without it being a "Life or Death" situation.



So how do we beat the heat safely? Heat waves occur every summer, but an extreme heat event happens when the temperature is more than 90 degrees and there is high humidity for at least two or three days. That kind of heat can be dangerous, particularly for us older adults here in Heritage Hunt. In fact, extreme heat is responsible for the highest number of annual deaths among all weather-related hazards. So, how do you stay cool when the heat is on? Try these tips:

• Do not use electric fans when the temperature outside is more than 95 degrees. You could increase the risk of heat-related illness. Fans create air flow and a false sense of comfort, but do not reduce body temperature.

• Find an air-conditioned location, like the Clubhouse or Marsh Mansion, to cool off especially when engaging in outdoor activities like Golf, Pickleball, Tennis or Bocce.

• Check on yourself, family members, and neighbors for signs of heat-related illness.

• Never leave a child, adult, or animal alone inside a vehicle on a warm day.

- Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing.
- Drink plenty of fluids to stay hydrated.
- Avoid high-energy activities.

Extreme heat exposure can cause severe illnesses. Here's what to you need to know:



Heat cramps. Signs of heat cramps include muscle pains or spasms in the stomach, arms, or legs. If you see signs of heat cramps, go to a cooler location.

Remove excess clothing. Take sips of cool sports drinks with salt and sugar. Get medical help if cramps last more than an hour.

Heat exhaustion. Symptoms include heavy sweating, paleness, muscle cramps, tiredness, weakness, dizziness, headache, fainting, nausea, and vomiting. If you have signs of heat exhaustion, go to an air-conditioned place, and lie down. Loosen or remove clothing. Take a cool bath. Take sips of cool sports drinks with salt and sugar. Call your health care provider if symptoms get worse or last more than an hour.

Heat stroke. This condition is more severe than heat exhaustion and is life threatening. Call 911 or get the person to the hospital immediately if they show these signs: body temperature over 103 degrees, red, hot, and dry skin with no sweat, rapid pulse, dizziness, confusion, or unconsciousness. Visit ready.gov/heat for more information on keeping cool during hot summer months.



THE GIVING CIRCLE

The **ARTfactory** of Manassas is one of the seventeen charities that received a grant from **The Giving Circle** in 2023. It provides a wide array of art therapies to children and adults. As a valuable support to those with mental health problems, these activities reduce conflicts and distress, improve cognitive functions, foster self-esteem, and build emotional resilience and social skills. These life skills are vitally important for the disadvantaged in our broader community.

The **ARTfactory** was founded in 1984 by a group of artists and art lovers with the goal of enriching the quality of life in the Northern Virginia region. Currently, they offer an art gallery, theatre arts, visual arts education, dance classes, Arts on the Go^{TM} , summer camps and SummerSounds Concert Series.



Studies have shown that the arts can activate pathways in the brain to reduce stress, lower anxiety, and improve mood.

This past year the **Giving Circle** grant was awarded to provide an "ARTfulWellness" series designed to assist those dealing with serious mental health issues. One participant noted that they learned tools to apply at home to "assist in their journey of mental wellness." In addition, last year's grant to the **ARTfactory** provided an opportunity for individuals to take visual and performing arts classes free of charge.

Over the next several months, the Grants Committee will be carefully vetting all applications for this year's grants to be awarded in October. All approved grants will support charities in the local Prince William community focused on mental and physical health, housing, food, clothing, and literacy.

GENEALOGY CLUB



The Genealogy Club will meet on Monday, June 24, at 2 PM in the Mt. View Room. We will learn how to create a "substitute" 1890 census for our American ancestors. The U.S. census for that year was mostly

destroyed by fire, leaving a gap in the decennial censuses that are so essential to family historians' research.

As we enter the summer months, give some thought to treating your family members, especially grandchildren, to visiting places where our history began, such as Plymouth, Massachusetts. The incredible "Plimouth Plantation" is a superb way to see how the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag Indians lived in 1627. You'll see role-players replicating in the Wampanoag Homesite and the English Village the activities that were carried out back then. You can even have a conversation with the actors, who will respond to you in the context of that era. The Crafts Center is also fun to explore, and you'll be able to chat with modern-day artesans as they reproduce common 17th-century items.

In nearby Plymouth Harbor rests the Mayflower II, a replica of the original. Walking around that ship is a stunning experience, making you aware of how cramped, tough, and difficult the conditions while the original ship crossed the Atlantic. Seeing is believing and realizing! The famous Plymouth Rock is close by. The town of Plymouth is replete with places to stay and eat, as well as to shop.

On the same trip, you can visit Boston's 2.5-mile Freedom Trail, which passes 17 historical locations, and Salem, the well-known site of the witch trials.

Our club is willing to provide a "Genealogy Beginners Session" on an individual basis if you give us 4-5 days' notice and can take that session right after a regular club meeting in the Mt. View Room at approximately 3:30 on the 4th Monday of the month (not in July or August). Give some thought to embarking on an exploration of the lives of those who came before you and coming across unexpected and fascinating discoveries in your family history.






Due to a generous donation from the Heritage Hunt Little Theater group, LSTV purchased a new Roland video switcher/mixer for use in the ballroom. This device will be used to enhance the stage back wall projection of video images for supporting HHLT and Concert events. With this device, LSTV will be able to add multiple images to the projection. This could include pre-recorded animated views outside windows or images of actors speaking off stage for HHLT. For Concerts, images of multiple performers or instruments could be projected. LSTV is continuing to improve its ability to provide support and enjoyment for Heritage Hunt groups and residents.

For the LSTV operator in the ballroom, this unit gives us the ability to do many tasks previously performed by operators who were in the downstairs control room. A small LSTV team can resolve issues face-to-face more efficiently and observe the event better in the room (getting the big picture). This results in a better show or meeting for residents and a better event recording using less manpower. Switching between images used to require operators to be in many places behind the console at the same time with dead time (frozen images with a delay) between operator commands. The Roland unit is now at our fingertips with instantaneous switching.
