

#### Are You Receiving Community Updates?

#### MARCH BOARD BRIEFS

One hopes we can skip the verse about March coming in like a Lion and hope for the Lamb all 31 days. We are all set for spring to start and daylight savings to return so we can get about all the outdoor activities available to us at Heritage Hunt.

We do thank all the Committee members and all interested residents that sat in on the HOA 101 that Board Vice President Jerry Fisher set up and ran on February 6. The session provided information about how the Association is run and where to find information on all our documents. The website also carries this information under HOA, just scroll down to HOA 101.

Between the Committees and the Board, we are busy with numerous projects. We are pleased that the acoustics project for the Red Oak Bar and Grill is moving along as it should help with noise levels in the bar area. We are also working on costs for the Clubhouse and Marsh Mansion parking lot expansions as well as monitoring the ongoing 24" force main line expansion and the new pump house installation.

Our new Point of Sale (POS) system is planned to go into operation in April. We moved the start date from February to allow for more training time for staff and management. The updated website should then be ready in May. We felt it was better to have all in place before we pushed forward on the new systems. In the meantime, the current POS system and Website will stay active; more details will follow.

AND Heritage Hunt is now 25 years old and we have residents who are very aware as they moved in at that time. The Board is planning a celebration for these residents on May 17 from 1-3 in the Clubhouse Ballroom. We are aware of some folks but anyone who is a 25 year resident, please contact our Lifestyle Director Janette Nash at lifestyle@heritagehunt.net by 4/30 so we can make sure you are included.

The following resolutions were reviewed at the January 25, 2024 Board meeting. Due to Horn publishing dates they are appearing a month late. For a quicker update, check the Board of Directors page on the website where the meeting minutes are posted within 2 weeks of the meeting date.

• Approved the reformation of the Advisory

Committee for Strategic Planning.

- Approved the purchase of a replacement fire wall for the Golf Maintenance Building.
- Approved repairs to the Clubhouse elevator.
- Approved the Golf Course maintenance schedule for the first half of 2024.
- Tabled a resolution dealing with the procurement of Golf Course Equipment to allow the Golf Committee time to provide more information to the Board.
- Approved allowing a 50% discount on August dues for existing golf members which includes no dues increases for them in 2024.

#### CROSSROADS CONNECTION



Crossroads continues to serve children with food insecurity in our western PWC public schools. We collect non-perishable products through food drives and donations from individuals and businesses, and also

purchase food with grant monies received from our local partners. This food is delivered to the schools by Crossroads volunteers. The last meal kids will partake of is lunch at school on Friday. The next meal is scheduled on Monday morning when schools serve the children breakfast. During Saturday and Sunday the children's parents often work more than one job, and nutritious snacks are not necessarily available. Crossroads aims to bridge the gap and prevent childhood hunger!

Through last month Crossroads served 15 schools to include elementary, middle and high school students. We are now adding our 16th school, Reagan Middle School. The total number of students served is expected to swell to 390. In 2023 we expanded our reach to 350 children. Why is there such a great demand? Food costs continue to be expensive...western Prince William County continues to grow...government subsidies continue to shrink...refugees continue to arrive.



#### THE NUREMBERG TRIALS



The Nuremberg trials of prominent Nazi war criminals were the first international war crimes ever held. This lecture traces the history of the laws of war; the organization of the Nuremberg Tribunal, and actions of the prosecutors, judges, defense counsel, and defendants. Psychiatric evaluations of same defendants are included, along with indictments, verdicts and sentences handed out. The details of the substantial and far-reaching legacy of Nuremberg are discussed. Twelve subsequent trials of Nazi war criminals were also held in Nuremberg. Nuremberg's precedents let to the establishment of the International Criminal Court.

The Nuremberg trials gave the leaders of a defeated nation, the benefit of the rule of law and due process with the presumption of innocence, something the defendants denied their millions of victims.

Steve Greenhouse received his PhD in Electrical Engineering from the Catholic University of America. He retired after working in the space communications field for 35 years. Steve has long held an acute interest in the Nuremberg trials and its legacy, the crimes that precipitated the trials, the perpetrators, and their motivation.

FLEXIBILITY CLASS HELPING RESIDENTS REDUCE PAIN AND BE MORE ACTIVE



Modifying a flexibility/mobility curriculum for an active older adult population took time, but it was worth the effort as your neighbors can attest to:

Ann: "This class has helped me immensely to manage my neck pain and my aching lower back. Huge improvement! Debbie will adjust and modify stretches to fit your needs."

#### THE GIVING CIRCLE

Mother Teresa would applaud how much THE GIVING CIRCLE puts into giving grants to charities in the Prince William County area. The committees of the GIVING CIRCLE work diligently for many hours to assure that each dollar given goes directly to the clients of the charities we support. Of most importance is selecting charities that focus on providing food, clothing, shelter, literacy, and mental and physical health to those in need.

The effort starts early in the calendar year when members are asked to renew their annual pledges and to actively recruit new members within the community. A "dollar a day" pledge gives a member voting privilege and the assurance that their money, along with others, will go wholly to the charities without any being used for administrative costs. Every dollar goes towards helping others.



Before grantees are selected, members are asked to suggest charities to be considered for grants. The Grants Committee will review these recommendations and decide whether or not to send an application.

Previous grantees are also asked to submit a grant request. Once the requests have been submitted to the committee, they begin a vigorous review of the applicants to ensure that the funds are targeted to the stated need.

During the months of July through September, the Grants Committee, consisting of GIVING CIRCLE members, reviews, and vets the requests. All members are then asked to vote on the recommendations of the committee. In October a reception is held in the ballroom where the recipient charities are presented with grant checks that support their goals. This is one the favorite GIVING CIRCLE meetings of the year as we get to meet some of the groups that make our gifts so worthwhile and where we hear how our gifts have helped those in need over the past year.



The residents of HH have and will continue to be known as those who care and show that by supporting many worthwhile causes in our broader community. By joining others in THE GIVING CIRCLE, we can have a greater impact by combining our gifts of "a dollar a day" or more with others. In 2023, \$91,700 was granted to seventeen organizations supporting the goals of THE GIVING CIRCLE. #### **GOLF COMMITTEE NEWS**

TO STAY OR NOT TO STAY . . .

Does the thought of not being able to golf on the Heritage Hunt (HH) course for 6-8 weeks this summer have you wondering whether to cancel your membership and play elsewhere? Unsure of what other nearby golf courses charge and what services are included in membership fees? Is HH truly the "bargain" that some say it is?

I was curious and examined the fees of 13 non-public courses within a 25-mile radius of HH. I compared memberships similar to HH's 18-Hole Resident Golf Membership. 8 courses are private; 5 are semi-private. This survey was informal and not all inclusive of the Northern Virginia area courses. However, I think their fees are representational of fees at many local courses.

Of the 13 courses reviewed, all 8 wholly private clubs have initiation fees ranging from \$2,500 to \$12,000. HH has no initiation fee. In 2023, the lowest monthly dues rate for the private courses was \$350; the highest was \$625. The median monthly dues rate was \$515. The HH resident rate will remain at \$282 per month through 2024. I did not have the 2024 fee schedules for the reviewed courses.

Of the 5 semi-private clubs, none charged an initiation fee. Two have monthly fee rates within \$10 of HH. The semi-private course closely located near HH has a monthly fee of over \$200 more per month than HH, but golfers pay the entire annual fee of over \$5500 at a one-time billing as opposed to HH which has a monthly billing. The 2 semi-private clubs charging similar fees to HH received overall golfer ratings of 3.5 and 4.0 compared to HH's rating of 4.5 on Trip Advisor. Comments indicate that the other courses may not be comparable to the well-manicured and playable HH standards.

During consideration of changing golf membership, have you also considered potential non-fee related intangibles inherent when golfing elsewhere. For example, are you willing to spend time and energy to find other groups with which to play at a new course? Will you miss the foursome you tee it up with weekly? What about the inconvenience of traveling to other courses for the rest of your playing days?

And one final notable consideration: In recognition of the interruption of play in August and September, the HH HOA at its January meeting agreed to hold the monthly rates in 2024 at the 2023 rates for current resident members and to reduce the August 2024 fees by 50%.

USGA Update: Have you noticed the GHIN website improvements? Now there's an automatic way to handle unfinished rounds and skipped holes. Check it out. Links to explanations can be found in the website "hidden" menu (top left corner).



This was the meeting to celebrate Sangiovese, the iconic Tuscan wine grape with its cherry notes and subtle aromas of tomato and Mediterranean spice. Sangiovese is the common denominator across most of the red wines experienced. We learned that Chianti, Vino Nobile di Montepulciano and Brunello di Montalcino are predominantly (often all) Sangiovese, and are wine region named, made under the Italian wine laws defining quality levels.

The Super Tuscans differ, as they feature international grapes that grow well in the Tuscan climate, such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot (and sometimes Syrah or Cabernet Franc.) Torciano blends native Sangiovese with international grapes to create some super (as in great) wines!

A reminder, at our February event we announced a planned increase to \$35 per person, beginning with our April event. This increase tracks with our rising costs to host the event and April's event sign up will reflect this new per person price.


