COMMUNICATION IS KEY!

Are you receiving important community updates? Heritage Hunt has numerous communication channels to keep you informed including the monthly newsletter (The Horn), community website (heritagehunt.net), Board and Committee meetings, the bulletin board in the Clubhouse (located on the wall outside of the Mt. View Room), HHTV (channels 971/972 on Comcast) and community wide e-mail blasts (The E-Communicator). The e-mail blasts are utilized for both updates and important announcements, however, recently we realize that sometimes so much information is sent out that Residents can begin to put communications on the shelf to read later or disregard as not pertaining to them. Often we hear that Residents did not read an important communication sent to them regarding services (trash, cable/internet, front gate operations, etc.), outages, facility closings or maintenance issues, or other important announcements. 

It's a wonderful tribute to John and his service to the Nation, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and the Prince William Community. John's accomplishments and service are well documented in this resolution.

WHEREAS, John William Lyver IV of Gainesville, a distinguished veteran of the United States Navy, former safety manager at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and passionate advocate for the well-being of the Prince William County community, died on June 16, 2024; and

WHEREAS, born in Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania, John Lyver graduated from the United States Naval Academy, where he sang in the choir and played trombone in the Drum & Bugle Corps; he went on to serve his country on active duty aboard the USS Du Pont and the USS Carl Vinson and later retired from the United States Navy Reserve with the rank of lieutenant commander; and

WHEREAS, in civilian life, John Lyver worked at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration for nearly 25 years; as the nuclear flight safety assurance manager in the Office of Safety and Mission Assurance, he led nuclear safety reviews of the Cassini-Huygens mission to Saturn, New Horizons mission to Pluto and the Kuiper Belt, and multiple missions to Mars before his well-earned retirement in 2012; and WHEREAS, John Lyver furthered his education with two masters degrees and a doctorate from George Mason University, and after his retirement, he inspired students as an adjunct professor of computational data sciences at his alma mater, earning the Teacher of Distinction award for his outstanding online instruction; and

WHEREAS, John Lyver also taught at Northern Virginia Community College and was involved with many civic and service organizations, including the National Society, Sons of the American Revolution, and American Legion Post 1799; and

WHEREAS, an Eagle Scout, John Lyver founded Boy Scouts of America Troop 1577 in Herndon and was a volunteer leader for many years; he was also a longtime elder and deacon in the Presbyterian Church; and

WHEREAS, John Lyver was well-known in the region for his tenacity and intellectual prowess as a volunteer member of the Prince William Data Center Ordinance Advisory Group, where he developed detailed analyses on data center noise, power consumption, financial impact, and other effects on the community; and

WHEREAS, John Lyver had recently been appointed to the Prince William County Planning Commission and was proud to use his technical expertise to help county officials make well-informed decisions on land use and zoning; and

WHEREAS, John Lyver will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife of nearly 16 years, Sally; his sons, John V and Thomas; his stepchildren, Stephanie and Andrew; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of John William Lyver IV, a distinguished veteran, respected scientist, and highly admired member of the Prince William County community; and, be it

ANNUAL INSPECTIONS

The Annual Inspections will resume in April 2025. Heritage Hunt remains very desirable in the real estate market in good part from the care and attention that you give to your property. Below are the most predominant courtesy notices associated with home exteriors. You can avoid receiving an inspection courtesy notice if these items are addressed prior to your inspection.

CLEANING (Design Guidelines Maintenance Standards page 3-9 Owners/Residents, General Rules, & Quick Reference Guide)

Check your siding, gutters, deck/porch, patio, stairwells, foundation, driveway, walkway and roof shingles of your home. These are all susceptible to dark sediment and mold growth and just need to be cleaned. These affected areas of your home should be cleaned PRIOR to your inspection month.



RUST & TARNISH (Design Guidelines Maintenance Standards page 4-General Rules)

The metal on your light fixtures, railings and AC units can **rust** over time.



This can be cured with rust-free exterior paint or for the lights, replacement of the fixtures. Check for rust or tarnish and have it taken care of PRIOR to your inspection.



REPAIR & PAINT (Design Guidelines Maintenance Standards page 4-9 Owners/Residents, General Rules, & Quick Reference Guide)

Check your home for **wood rot** and **chipped or worn** paint on exterior areas of the home, such as window and door trim, foundations, driveways, and stairwells. This notice requires more attention as it will include repair and/or re-painting. Please think ahead with your month of Annual Inspections and have the necessary work completed in advance.









LAWN & LANDSCAPE (Design Guidelines Maintenance Standards page 3, 5-9 Owners/Residents, & Quick Reference Guide)

All yards need to have some type of week control. It does not matter whether the weeds are in the rear, or in the landscape beds, or if you have a very small lot, you still need to have control over weeds on your property.

- Any lawn growth **above 6 inches** is a violation and this violation uniquely requires a speedy 10-day remediation.
- When mowing, please remember to trim all grass that is missed from the mower.
- Please keep trees and shrubs trimmed back to your property line. If you have a tree at the sidewalk, remember to keep the height of the branches trimmied up for walking clearance. Winter is a good time for trimming the trees & shrubs.





MAILBOXES (Design Guidelines Maintenance Standards page 7 Quick Reference Guide)

Check your mailbox for numbers on both sides and for faded or peeling numbers that need to be replaced. If your mailbox post has faded stain or paint, or if it has mold, please clean and freshen up the paint or stain on your post. Also please keep your white Washington Post box clean or remove it if it is cracked and broken.



HH GOLF 25TH ANNIVERSARY YEAR TOURNAMENTS

Exciting Events and Key Dates

Golf Tournaments are just around the corner as we kick off the 25th Anniversary Year of Heritage Hunt Golf. As in years past, the Tournament Subcommittee has presented a variety of both fun and challenging events. On June 21st, the Member-Guest Tournament will take place, and it does not require a handicap as the Calloway format is used. You may bring up to three guests, and it is a special opportunity to bring friends and family to play on our new turf at a substantially reduced fee. If you haven't participated in the past, consider giving this event special consideration this year.

September Scramble

A new event this year, the September Scramble, is scheduled for the 20th. It follows the same A-B-C-D format as the Icebreaker, encouraging maximum participation by new members who may have joined over the summer.

Club Championship and Member-Member Tournament

The Club Championship is now scheduled for August. The Member-Member Tournament in

October will be our final tournament, culminating in the Top Gun Shoot Out as the grand finale.

GOLF - CART PATHS

WALKERS, WATCH OUT FOR THAT GOLF BALL!!....THUNK!! (OOPS, TOO LATE)



For many of us, the beauty of the community, including the golf course, was a major factor in our decision to purchase a home in

Heritage Hunt. And there is a temptation to get closer to that beauty by taking a walk or jog on the golf course cart paths. BUT, BEWARE!! Danger is lurking for walkers anytime golfers are on the golf course!

As a golfer, I am quite aware that golfers spray their golf shots in all directions! I am always vigilant of who is getting ready to hit their ball and where I am positioned with respect to this golfer. I am especially observant if I am on the cart path within 200 yards of golfers hitting from the teebox. I have had several playing partners struck by golf balls, in the arm, leg, torso, and even the head. It is very dangerous, given the speed that the ball is traveling, and it is not a pretty sight to be struck! And some of these injuries have required medical treatment and/ or kept the injured party from being able to perform normal activities for several weeks. The concern about non-golfers being on the course with golfers is that the non-golfer would not be as observant as to where the golfers are and whether or not the non-golfer is in the potential line of flight of the golf ball.

As a non-golfer, you may have wondered: "When can I use the golf course cart paths?" Many private golf clubs (similar to ours) do not allow use

of any part of the golf course (including cart paths) by non-golfers at any time! The Heritage Hunt policy, written in the Heritage Hunt Golf Rules and Regulations is as follows:

"During operating hours, only Golfers, persons authorized by the HOA, or persons authorized by the Golf Services Vendor, may be on or use the golf course, including cart paths. Non-golfers are prohibited from access to the golf course during golf course operating hours."

Golf course operating hours vary throughout the year. In general, this is defined as sunrise to sunset, as that is when golfers or golf maintenance personnel may be on the golf course, including using cart paths. If you want to walk on the cart paths, but are unsure if golfers are on the course, contact the Heritage Hunt Pro Shop (703-743-1000).

So, the rule of thumb for non-golfers is, if you see golfers on the golf course, please stay off of the course and cart paths, for your own safety!





A Look Behind the Curtain

I asked some of our technically gifted people to explain some of the things we do that this community never sees. If we/our community can hear the band or the microphones work, everybody goes home happy.

The equipment that LSTV supports belongs to this community, so when I say we, I mean all of us, not just LSTV.

We just went through a significant equipment upgrade in the MVR and Ballroom. We successfully replaced (2) sound mixers. There were so many intermittent failures of the mixers, they were degrading the quality of the events. What does a "sound mixer" do? When there is a Board of Directors (BOD) meeting, there are 12 microphones that need to be balanced by LSTV volunteers, using the sound mixers. This balancing makes sure that each BOD member and the resident mic can be heard at the optimum level, both in the room as well as out to the community via the HHTV broadcast. LSTV needs a minimum of (6) people to support a BOD meeting.

To replace those mixers, the old mixers had to be removed from the rack, the new mixers physically installed, configured and integrated into the LSTV system. This engagement took 7 LSTV volunteers and (5) days to complete. This is why January events in the MVR and the Ballroom had to be juggled and coordinated.

After the physical installation, there was a period of verification, testing and training to confirm our expectations were met. The good news is that because of the dedication and teamwork of your LSTV team, the new equipment performed flawlessly at our last BOD meeting to the point that nobody was able to tell that a significant change had taken place, and the community received a better-quality experience.

Once again, we could hear the band, and the microphones worked and everyone went home happy.

Most of the sound and light equipment here at HH is 10-15 years old and is failing intermittently. Our community as well as LSTV has a level of expectation for shows and committee meetings. When the equipment can no longer perform to its expected level, it's the brilliant volunteers at LSTV saying, "The Show must go on!"







PAT RUSCH


