MAY BOARD BRIEFS

We made it, it's May and time to get ready for the outdoor pool to open for the season, from Memorial Day to Labor Day (may every day be sunny and warm!) There will be new lifeguards to meet as we have a new pool management company, Continental Pools. So do come meet the staff at the outdoor pool and enjoy just being at the pool.

Our indoor pool will be closing in order for us to get needed pool ceiling repairs done. The rest of the Fitness Center will be in operation as usual and the repair work will be done before it is time to close the outdoor pool. We thank the Facilities Committee and CAMP Management for helping the Board get all this work organized so quickly.

We also thank CAMP Management for working on the new Point of Sales (POS) which is in place, as well as the new Website which will become operative this month. Management will provide tutorials on use of the website navigation. We did this the last time we changed over websites and we all found them very useful, even the super techies!!

Further, we are actively seeking new vendors to run the Food/Beverage amenity at Heritage Hunt. Requests were received from 8 vendors on 5/6. The Board, with the assistance of the Food & Beverage Consultant Michael Sternberg, are reviewing the proposals to find the right one for Heritage Hunt.

We are also seeking a vendor for the Golf course area. GGA/Partners was hired to be the Golf Operations/Course Maintenance Consultant and they are at work collecting RFP's so a decision can also be made for that area. The Board thanks UTP for their continued professionalism as we work through this transition period.

We have numerous projects on going at the same time including the above as well as working on Master Plan Phase 1 Clubhouse and Marsh Mansion parking lot expansion, as well as monitoring PWCSA work on the new pump station and 24" force main. The Board, as well as Management, makes every effort to keep the information flowing to the community in a timely manner. However, we are told that more information should be made available more quickly. We certainly are open to ideas on how this can be done. We request that ideas, issues and concerns be

sent to the Board at boardofdirectors@ heritagehunt.net. We do like these "in writing" so we can better answer and work on these matters. There are 2 televised Board meetings a month. The dates in May are May 13 and May 23. May 13 is at 9:30 am in the Mt. View Room and May 23 is at 1 pm in the Ballroom. Do plan to attend or at least watch on HHTV channels 970/971.

The following resolutions were approved at the 3/28 Board meeting. Because of Horn publishing dates they are appearing a month late. For a faster review do check the HH website as the minutes are posted 2 weeks after each meeting.

- Approved Continental Pools to do white coating on the outdoor pool.
- Approved a Level 2 Reserve study to be done by Building Reserves.
- Approved added funding for 4 more resident excursions.
- Approved Charter revisions for Architectural Review, Budget and Finance and Investment/Cash Management Committees.
- Approved a modified resolution allowing purchase as needed of Golf Course Maintenance equipment.

INTENSIVE ADULT MENTAL HEALTH



CROSSROADS CONNECTION



Earlier this year Crossroads served 300 children. Soon the demand grew by 30% to a total of 390 children. They are students in our local western PWC schools who suffer from food insecurity. Through food drives and donations from individuals and businesses, and via grant monies from

local partners, the students receive non-perishable food products courtesy of Crossroads volunteer packers and drivers. The bulk of the administrative costs that the organization incurs is for rent of its facility where all food is stored and volunteers meet to pack. There are zero payroll expenses.

The news of food insecurity as it pertains to our student population has caught the attention of young people who do not need food assistance. These kids have taken on leadership roles to organize food drives. WHERE IN THE WORLD IS HERITAGE HUNT

Have you ever wondered where in the world Heritage Hunt is? It may seem like a silly question since we all know HH is in Gainesville, Virginia. But do you know specifically where Heritage Hunt is by latitude and longitude? The Emergency Preparedness Committee does. And we know the latitude of each and every residence, facility, pond, bocce-tennis-pickleball court and golf hole and tee. In case it comes up during one of HH's Trivia Contests, the center of Heritage Hunt is located at 38.81461 North and -77.598709 West.

Although some of you may say, "so what", Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Analysts use geographic data (like latitude and longitude - among other data) to make maps and interpret geographic relationships. If any of you are or were GIS Analysts, please contact Al Grimmig (epcalgrimmig@gmail.com).

The EPC just completed detailed maps of Heritage Hunt, that have been printed on 36" x 48" foam boards. These maps will be used during Emergency Training Exercises and actual emergencies to identify the location of medical emergencies and the location of damage to facilities or utilities. Each residence is identified by house number so we can make sure we send assistance to the correct place. Knowing where things are in relationship to other things around it is important, especially if there is damage to our roads that require the rerouting of traffic, or the evacuation of parts of Heritage Hunt during emergencies.

One of the maps will be on display in the Clubhouse library. If you would like to see a digital copy of the HH map, let the Emergency Preparedness Committee know using the following email address:



GARDEN CLUB

Gardeners, Virginia's bird population has been in serious decline. The best sanctuaries for birds are undisturbed expanses of forests and meadows. Anyone can see that those are rapidly disappearing in Northern Virginia, and where they remain, they are shrinking below the size needed for many species. Those in charge of any patch of land can help some of these birds by adding plants to expand the habitat value of nearby parks and natural areas.

What does it take to provide sanctuary for birds? The first requirement is that the plants be native to the local ecosystem. This is because the diet of baby birds consists primarily of caterpillars, and most caterpillars can only eat the plants with which they evolved. By far the biggest source of food for caterpillars is the leaves of large native shade trees, by virtue of their immense canopy compared to smaller plants. The second requirement is to provide food for the adults. Adult birds also require caterpillars, plus other bugs for protein. They also need seeds and fruits from smaller native trees, shrubs, vines, and flowers. These are tailored to their nutritional needs, unlike many non-native plants. Different bird species feed and nest at different heights from the ground, so native plants are needed at all levels. You may notice the preference of sparrows and robins for the ground layer, bluebirds for the shrubs, bluejays higher still, and woodpeckers in the canopy. As some birds require the lower level is the reason why it is important to keep cats indoors.

Another reason to install native plants at the ground layer is that many of those caterpillars feeding up in the trees spend part of their life cycles sheltering on the ground. They cannot find the habitat they need in mounds of mulch, not to mention in lawns where they get chopped up by lawn mowers. What does provide shelter is native perennials and dead leaves. So once you have your trees and shrubs in place, you can have the fun of exploring numerous native ground cover options, gradually expanding the landing pad out to the drip line as the trees grow. Some of this could involve a new garden sense for some of us here at Heritage Hunt. Come to Garden Club to hear how we create our garden arrangements! Our next meeting is May 23 at 10:00 in Marsh Mansion.

"Secret Voices: A Year of Women's Diaries," edited by Sarah Gristwood, was just published this past February by Batsford (a London publisher). In 528 pages, it contains extracts from women's diaries from the 17th through 20th centuries, describing their feelings about being female in a male-dominated world. Frustration, thus, is commonly expressed.





LSTV CORNER

All the people at LSTV are there to serve our community. So, we are always looking for ways through the technology we support, to enhance the "go to" experience when someone goes to a concert or goes to Trivia Night or to Movie Night. You might not actually see what we are doing, but you absolutely will feel some of the changes and enhancements we are making. Below are two of our new capabilities.

New LSTV Console Design

LSTV has upgraded the console in the Ballroom. The new design has a raised floor that allows for cabling from the console to the control rack. (There is a lot of equipment in the rack right next to the

console. Cabling can now travel under the floor, out of the way, to the equipment on the console, versus across the floor where someone like me can dislodge it.)

The console is two feet longer to provide spacing for up to four people to operate the audio and video equipment. We now have adequate room to operate cameras, computers, lighting, plus audio equipment for concerts, committee meetings and presentations, like Town Hall meetings in the Ballroom more efficiently and adding greater capabilities that enhance the total experience.

If you see someone at the console, please feel free to join us anytime to get a close look at our new capabilities.

Video Editing

The biggest challenge to Video Editing is having a person with the knowledge, equipment, and creativity to be able to pull something like this off. That person is Ralph Pugh. In his words:

After taking many megabytes of recordings, the challenge for the video editor was to...

- Put it all together into a meaningful storyline that has a flow.
- Chop, splice, and edit the recordings to capture the best parts and keep it succinct.
- Attempt to make it more visually interesting by zooming in on certain video shots, splitting the screen to combine pertinent photos into interview videos. Adding AI generated voices to introduce the scenes. Adding music and transitions enhances viewing pleasure.

When you watch a video, we create or the videos on the back wall at concerts, they typically have been enhanced by our video editor. We are continually tinkering with what we can do to make the experience better.

All this technology might seem daunting, but please instead of thinking, "Oh no, technology is too hard," think Yes, opportunities to learn and grow!" Our brains aren't done yet. Let's grow together.



HH CHAPTER OF THE **AMERICAN WINE SOCIETY**

May is the month we see "Rosé All Day" signs posted at many Virginia wineries, with this pink wine popular for Mother's Day outings, whether at one of our local wineries or at brunch. Rosé is the perfect wine to kick off the start of summer, it's served chilled, is fruity and food friendly and the new vintage of rosé is released each year in the spring.

So, what is it about this pink wine which makes it so popular? It can range in color from the lightest, palest pink, to a beautiful salmon color and even a vivid purply-fuchsia? I think it's popularity is tied to the wine's versatility. It's great to sip all by itself but also pairs well with all kinds of food and is made in many different styles. Favorite pairings include creamy cheeses such as goat cheese or mozzarella just about any Mediterranean style fare, shellfish and all types of tomato dishes.

Rosé is made with red grapes; almost any red grape from Grenache to Cabernet Sauvignon. It spends very little time during the winemaking process on the red grape skins, resulting in the pink (vs. red) color. It can spend less than an hour but often spends 12-24 hours on skin contact. The wine club sampled Arterra's Rosé, a deep purply pink, robust rosé made with Petit Verdot and Cab Franc at our March event and Slater Run Vineyard's Rosé, made in the Provence style, at our April wine club event.



We'll skip rosé wine at our Tuesday, May 21st event with Williams Gap Vineyard and are looking forward to Bridgette Smith, their general manager,

presenting a selection of white and red wines made from their 35+ acres under vine in Round Hill. Watch your email for sign up links and if you're not getting our emails drop a note to heritagehuntwineclub@gmail.com.

BIRDS

It's that time of year again – the birds are back!

Yes – they are back and they are building nests to have baby birds. That means that the smaller birds are looking for secure places to put their nests and what better place than in your attic? Your attic is safe from predators and warm for the babies.



How do they get there? When the builders installed the porch lights in the community, they used the cheapest ones possible. Those lights had a very

small base that screwed into the ceiling of the porches. The grooves in the soffit provided a superhighway for small birds to enter the house under the light fixture.

Quick solution – get a light fixture with a larger base such as the one illustrated above. Some folks enhanced the base by adding a flat disk under the fixture that extends beyond its edge just to give the little blighters more of a challenge.



In addition, I hang a small owl on the porch. Our feathered friends don't like predators and avoid the statue. In fact, after five years, I haven't had to move the statue at all and the birds have not come back.

I've also heard that people mount about 5 feet of garden hose wrapped to look like a snake near the light fixture. Owl

or snake, either will scare the budgies off.

Before you replace your light fixture take a quick look at Page 43 of the 2023 Design Guidelines (available on the Heritage Hunt website) for guidance on color of the fixture.

YOUR VOTE IS YOUR VOICE

DOING THE RIGHT THING...SOLAR AND MORE

Since I moved to Heritage Hunt from Pennsylvania about 3 years ago, I have thought about the many ways we are NOT helping our environment here in Northern Virginia,

I've been concerned about our Earth's environment for years. Following a visit to England in the 1980's when I discovered I couldn't buy groceries because I didn't bring my own bag., my husband and I arranged with Webb Mfg. (where my husband was CFO) to make 60,000 mesh bags with the backing of Sierra Club and a local grocery chain. We then promoted bringing your own bag (BYOB) and sold them at Fresh Fields (later Whole Foods). We sold many of these bags at the Earth Day celebration in 1990 in Philadelphia. I would see people with them later at Farmer's Markets and stores.

In Pennsylvania, our ECO group at our church got very involved in everything from discouraging pesticide use on area lawns, buying organic to protesting the toxic Monsanto"Round Up". We had workshops to make solitary bee hotels as we heard that Neonics were wiping out bee pollinators. We paraded in bee costumes with signs "NO BEES NO FOOD". We had movies and talks about West Virginia removing mountain tops to mine for coal, doing terrible damage to the waterways, towns, and views, We promoted alternatives to gas and coal such as geothermal heating and cooling and solar power,

Our church garden taught kids where food comes from and the importance of pollinators, composting, and planting native plants, even making rain barrels.

We were the first church to buy wind power and soon added solar to the roof. We marched on Washington to fight the pipelines from Canada, and we fought against fracking in northern counties of PA protesting the damage to the environment and the leaking of methane, the most potent greenhouse gas.

A dream now is to one day see solar arrays at all large parking lots, creating electricity while shading cars. I am sickened seeing all the food waste, the plastic bags, and pesticide use as we strive for perfect lawns and convenience, unaware unaware of the stinky result in landfills, or the plastic that pollutes ocean life...and us.

I'm encouraging my neighbors to collect their

kitchen waste in compostable bags (which can be frozen) to take to the Balls Ford recycling center where hopefully the Farm group that collects it for fertilizer will add more containers as we advocate for reducing our waste,.

Last December, with my daughter's help, I sold 30 paintings and with the proceeds decided to put a solar array on my south-facing roof,.

As data centers proliferate, the future of our electricity supply is in doubts, so I thought it might be smart to save on my electric bill and use the sun for energy. The tax write-off is a real bonus. Solar will also add at least 5% to the value of my house, and is simply the right thing to do.

Thankfully our HOA has been very quick to approve the design and my company plans to install it right away. The sun will soon be powering my air conditioner, I only wish I had an electric car.




