

NOVEMBER BOARD BRIEFS

Here come the holidays and while we may wonder where the year went, getting together with family and friends makes it all worthwhile. Especially this year as it has been a very "interesting" one for Heritage Hunt.

We have recovered from the Club House renovation from the fire suppression system water leaks and we have navigated around the PWSCA 24" force main line and pump system rebuild work. We are grateful for the patience the community has shown as we dealt and deal with these issues.

Of course November is also election season and our voting will start November 6 - December 4th. To learn more about the declared candidates, do plan to come meet them on November 3 at 10 am in the Ball Room. Details on ways to vote are in the Horn and any questions can be directed to Management

The Board has 2 meetings in November. The Working meeting is Monday November 6 at 9:30am in the Mt View Room with the General Meeting on Thursday November 16 at 1 pm in the Mt. View Room. These meetings will wrap up a lot of the Community business including laying out the 2024 Budget and assessment numbers. We are pleased that so many residents did attend budget sessions and got to ask their questions. We are all owners and we need to be involved.

The following resolutions were approved at the September 28th Board meeting. Due to Horn publishing dates they appear here a month late. For a faster review check the Board of Director's page on the HH website where minutes are posted within 2 weeks of any meeting.

- Approved The Goldklang Group to prepare the 2023 and 2024 audits and file the Association's 2023 and 2024 tax returns.
- Approve a change order of \$2,000 for added tests required by PWC for permits related to our parking lot expansions.
- Approved a write off of \$16,999.52 in uncollectable club accounts.
- Approved a write off of \$11,340.00 for a no show event.

- · Approved an annual contract in the amount of \$10,095 to Metro Water for common area irrigation services.
- · Approved moving 16 Repair and replacement projects and 3 Roads Reserve projects from 2023 to 2024.
- Approved awarding a contract to Walker Consultants for the inspection of the indoor pool ceiling at a cost of \$12,800 from Reserves.
- Approved a sole source contact of \$34,950 to Sydnor Hydro for the remediation of the well on Box Elder Pond that feeds Box Elder and is used for golf course irrigation.
- Approved Golf Course closure for Maintenance on 6 Mondays in October and November.
- Approved a revision to the LSTV charter to add an Appendix A related to use of LSTV volunteers and LSTV equipment.



2023 ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTION

The 2023 Annual Meeting and Election will be held on Tuesday, December 5 at 3:00 pm in the Clubhouse Great Oak Ballroom. The Annual Meeting Notice was mailed to all owners of record in October. The governing documents require a quorum of 20% of owners be present at the Annual Meeting or represented by Proxy to conduct the meeting and hold the election.



Eligibility to Vote: You must be a homeowner and be in good standing with the Association by October 15, 2023. Renters are not eligible to vote.

Three Ways to Vote:

- 1) Online You will receive an email from Simply Voting for casting your vote using a secure balloting system. Online voting begins on Monday, November 6 at 8:30 am and ends Monday, December 4 at 5:00 pm.
- 2) Proxy Ballot Paper Ballots and a Proxy Envelope are included in the Annual Meeting Notice. Submit the envelope to the Clubhouse Front Desk no later than Monday, December 5 at 5:00 pm. You must sign the envelope and have your signature witnessed.
- 3) In Person at the Annual Meeting —
 Registration will open at 2:00 pm on
 Tuesday, December 6 prior to the meeting Call to Order at 3:00 pm. To register,
 go to the Registration Table where you
 will be given a voting packet; if you did not
 vote online or via Proxy Ballot. Place your
 completed ballot in the ballot box prior to
 the beginning of the meeting or during the
 meeting when the vote is called.

There will be no Floor Nominations or Write-In Candidates on the ballot at the Annual Meeting.

WINTERIZING YOUR HOSE BIBBS

OK – so what's a hose bibb and why should I winterize it?

- · Your hose bibb is an outside water faucet.
- Because it is outside, it and the exterior piping that leads to the inside of the building are subject to freezing which can lead to a quite expensive plumbing and, if left unrepaired long enough, structural damage to the home.

OK – so how do I do it?

On the inside of your house, in an area where there is exposed plumbing nearest to the exterior hose bibb there is a cut-off valve. In my home, a 1-1/2 floor Danbury without a basement, the cut-off valves are in the utility room and the master bath. Yours may be in another location.



My utility room cut-off valve looks like the image here. It is near the hot-water heater.

If you have a basement, at least one and perhaps two of the cut-off valves are in the basement.


The first thing you do to winterize is to shut off the water from inside

the house using the cut-off valve. The old saying "Righty tightly- lefty loosie" is true. Turn the knob clockwise (to the right) and you will turn off the outside water.

Go outside and turn on the hose bibb to check - if no water comes out you've done it correctly - if water comes out, try again. Turn the hose bibb off again.

Now that the water is turned off in both places it is time to purge the standing water from the system. Look for the relief knob (sometimes called a cap) on the cut-off valve. Mine looks like the image in the next column. It is on top of my cut-off valve.

Loosen the cap (remember lefty loosie) by turning the cap counterclockwise.



If the cap has a hole in it, loosen it about three turns.

Now go to the outside hose bib and open it all the way (lefty). If the hose bib is inside the

garage you might want to place a bucket or pan under it to catch the fluid that will drain out.

When that bibb is drained shut it, return to the inside turn-off valve and tighten the cap finger tight. If nothing comes out you should completely remove the cap on the shut-off valve on the inside

If there is no hole in the cap you will have to remove the cap all the way.



Be careful not to remove or lose the black 0-Ring inside of the cap. They are hard to replace and you don't want to end up with a \$500 dollar replacement of the entire apparatus

because you lost a 5-cent 0-ring. The image here shows the 0-ring.



In my Danbury, there is a rear hose bibb. The shut-off is under the sink nearest the windows in the Master Bath. The image on the left shows what it looks like. The red knob and relief cap on the shut-off valve are visable in the image.

In this one, you must clean out the area under the cut-off valve and put a pan or container under the cut-off valve. The residual water WILL drain into the area under the sink.

The cap in this case is on the side of the cut-off valve.

Go through the same steps

- Shut off the cut-off valve (clockwise-righty).
- · Go outside and shut off hose bibb
- Go inside and remove the cap. CAREFUL Don't lose the 0-ring
- · Go outside and open the hose bibb
- · Wait about 5 minutes
- Close the hose bibb
- Go inside and replace the cap and screw it finger tight
- Clean up the water that missed the pan in my case, the initial water is under pressure and usually misses the pan. A grunge towel comes in handy.

You may want to purchase protective covers for the outside hose bibs. They are cheap and, with proper draining of your hose bibb, you will have double protection.

Enjoy your house this winter.

ANOTHER HIDDEN COST OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES

Wow – the things that salespeople don't tell you. We learn all the benefits of electric vehicles but none of the hidden costs. Have you considered that electric vehicles may affect your homeowners and liability insurances?

Section 55.1-1823.1(C) of the Virginia Property Owners' Association Act, requires any lot owner installing an EV charger to indemnify and hold the Association harmless from all liability, including reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the Association resulting from a claim arising out of the installation, maintenance, operation, or use of such electric charging station.

The law also enables the HOA to require that homeowners buy and maintain insurance to cover the indemnification including the HOA's attorney's fees.

Currently, Heritage Hunt does not do the latter clause because it is unnecessary under the law. We do suggest that you contact your insurance company about this coverage and any upgrades to your policy because you have an electric vehicle charging station. If you have a "bundle" from your insurance company where you have both homeowners and vehicle insurance it does not hurt to make sure that your liability and home insurance are consistent with your vehicular insurance. If you have different companies then it's up to you to align the policies.

This topic also made me remember some of the information I've been reading about electric vehicle fires lately. Aside from the over-hyped dangers you read in the media, these electric vehicles are extremely safe. Here are some of the basic rules for charging stations I've read.

- Make sure the charging station matches your vehicle. It is best to buy the charging station and the car as a package. This will give you the best, fastest charge and very much reduce the danger of fire or electrocution. Please do not buy no-name generic charging stations off the internet.
- Have the charger installed by a licensed electrician under permit from Prince William County.

Remember my article about how insurance works? My insurance company (one of the highest rated in the country) looks at risk and tries to transfer the liability to others. Basically, if the home improvement is required to be permitted by the county and was not then the loss is not covered.

Installation of a charging station needs to be performed by a licensed electrician under permit and inspected by the county.

"SPY PILOT: FRANCIS GARY POWER, THE U-2 INCIDENT, AND A CONTROVERSIAL COLD WAR LEGACY."



An international diplomatic crisis erupted in 1960 when the USSR shot down an American U-2 spy plane in Soviet Air Space and captured its pilot, Francis Gary Powers.

Do you remember this incident? Do you remember how President Eisenhower and the Soviets dealt with the political fallouts? Did the relationship between these two superpowers changed during the Cold War? What happened to Gary Powers? Be ready to listen and relive with Gary Powers Jr., son of pilot Gary Powers, the story that kept this country on pins and needles, wondering: what will happen next?


Gary Powers Jr. is the Founder and Chairman Emeritus of The Cold War Museum established in 1996. He is also an Honorary Board Member of The International Spy Museum and a Past Board Member of the SAC (Strategic Air Command) Aerospace Museum. He lectures internationally and appears regularly on C-SPAN, the History, Discovery, and A & E Channels. He has worked with the National Park Service to identify historic Cold War sites for preservation.

Mr. Powers is the author of Enemy Territory (2022), Letters from a Soviet Prison (2017), and Spy Pilot (2019). In 2015, he consulted for a Steven Spielberg Cold War thriller, Bridge of Spies, about James Donovan who brokered the 1962 spy exchange between KGB spy Rudolph Abel and CIA U-2 pilot Francis Gary Powers, Sr. Mr. Powers holds a BA in Philosophy, and Master's Degrees in Public Administration and History. He is married and has one son.

UPCOMING IMPORTANT DATES FOR PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY

Many residents may be aware that Board of County Supervisors Chair Ann Wheeler has scheduled a Public Hearing and vote on all 3 Rezoning applications for the controversial Prince William Digital Gateway (PWDG) for Tuesday, December 12th at 2 PM.

The Planning Office Staff Report and recommendation will probably be released in late October or early November. A review of this report will enable us to identify and critique any omissions or shortcomings in the application in preparation for the Planning Commission Public Hearing.

What are our remaining options to affect the outcome of this vote?

On October 25th, the nearby Oak Valley HOA held a court hearing on their amended complaint to the Prince William Digital Gateway Comprehensive Plan Amendment. We may learn valuable information that could bolster arguments against the rezoning.

We will be asking for a strong community presence at the Board of County Supervisors hearing on December 12th where you can offer three minutes of comments on the PWDG proposal.

Should the PWDG Rezoning be approved, there is a 30-day window during which a legal challenge can be made.

Use the next six weeks to make your voice heard, in writing, and in the media. If you have not had an opportunity to vote yet, Early Voting is open through Saturday, November 4th. Election Day is November 7th.



EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

KEEPING HERITAGE HUNT SAFE - HOW WE ARE ORGANIZED

How do you cover over a mile-wide and mile and a half long community with 4,000 residents and visitors on a rolling plain cut in half by a small river? It ain't easy.

Volunteers (EVs)
will be using

walkie-talkies to provide that vital link to obtain medical or other emergency assistance when telephone service stops functioning. However, the size and terrain limit the range of walkie-talkies. Therefore, we have set up three zones, each with a Zone Director and volunteers located in the Club House, Golf Facility, and the Marsh Mansion. As shown, the South Zone includes the areas South of the Little Bull Run Creek, the remaining areas are split by Heritage Hunt Drive, areas on the West side of the Drive are in the North-West Zone and those on the East are in the East Zone.



So how do we communicate across the Zones if walkie-talkies are so limited? Well, thanks to the good graces of the Heritage Hunt Ham Radio Club, Ham Radio Operators will be located in each Zone and in our Central Coordination Center (CCC) to send critical messages within Heritage Hunt as shown. More importantly, these operators can also use these powerful Ham Radios to request assistance from County Emergency Services. To ensure we can maintain this vital communication, the EPC has emergency generators located at each of these facilities along with the maps, radios, and other equipment necessary to continue operations for several days while we wait for electricity and cell service to be restored.

As always, the EPC continues to prepare to assist in keeping those at Heritage Hunt health and safe, but you have a part. Remember to add the T-Comm number (703) 743-2016 into all your phones as "T-Comm Heritage Hunt" so you will receive what could be lifesaving notifications, and remove and review the Emergency Guidance insert from the middle of the August Horn. You will see the EPC out next month, on December 2, 2023, as we place stakes at the fire hydrants to assist the fire department to locate them following a heavy snow.

Watching the news, we continue to see tragic events, hurricanes or blizzards, that result in needless loss of life because the community was inadequately prepared. The EPC, relying upon our EVs and members of the Ham Radio Club, are working to be prepared to effectively respond to these life threating events here at Heritage Hunt. This requires your help. We want to encourage you to join us as a volunteer, either as an EV or Ham Radio Operator. By all of us working together during these emergencies, we can mitigate these events to prevent them from becoming tragic, thereby striving to better protected our neighbors, friends, and family.

They add valuable organic matter to the soil and provide nesting sites for beneficial insects and small wildlife. Wait to cut stems back until temps are consistently above 50 degrees F. Many bees, butterflies, and other pollinators shelter in stems during winter.



GROUNDS COMMITTEE



I hope your Hallowe'en was full of treats, and light on the hobgoblins! Now we are facing November but we are not done with the garden yet. If you want to look forward to a pretty Spring show, now is the time to plant bulbs (or geophytes to give them their proper name). Here are some suggestions:

The following small, early flowering bulbs are all ephemeral and do well planted underneath deciduous trees as they flower before the tree leafs out and then disappear underground until next Spring. If left alone, they will all multiply naturally and are best if allowed to form colonies.

Snowdrops (Galanthus nivalis): One of the earliest to bloom, snowdrops can be seen poking up through the snow as early as February. They are sure to lift your spirits in the dark days of February with a promise of better days to come.

Winter Aconite (Eranthis hyemalis): Like the snowdrop, Winter Aconite blooms very early but has a yellow flower and is in the Buttercup family. At about 6" tall, they also do well in colonies but Aconites are poisonous so don't plant them where children or pets are likely to mess with them.

Scilla (Siberian or wood squill): Flowering in March, Scilla's stunning blue flowers are a delight and pair beautifully with miniature early flowering daffodils. Scilla are easy to grow and are very hardy. A lovely addition to your Spring garden.

Crocus: Commonly yellow or mauve, crocuses are the harbingers of Spring. They do well "en masse" and can be grown with miniature daffodils (or pansies if you are not troubled by deer browsing). Squirrels enjoy the bulbs (or corms actually) and will sometimes dig them up. Crocuses do not like to have a lot of mulch thrown on top of them so go easy on the amount you use in the Autumn.

Grape Hyacinth (Muscari): Topping out at about 9" grape hyacinth is easy to grow in full sun or part shade and looks good with crocuses, miniature daffodils, violas and pansies. Commonly blue, they can also bloom pink and occasionally white. They will naturalize but are easy to control.

The following prefer to be planted in open areas and generally flower later than the above selections.

Daffodils (Narcissus): Daffodils and Jonquils commonly flowering yellow can also be found in white, shades of orange and even occasionally pink. They are famously deer, rabbit and squirrel proof due to an alkaloid toxicity, which means they taste bad! They are long lived and they naturalize given the space, but they do need a long time for the foliage to die back and they need to be allowed to do this without being cut back because the bulb needs the nutrients to be re-absorbed. Plant them in amongst perennials which will grow up around the browning foliage to hide it, or plant your daffodil bulbs in pots and bury the pots in the Fall. Dig the pots up after the daffodils have flowered and put them in an inconspicuous place where they can be left to die back in peace. If you cut back the foliage before it has gone brown and limp, your daffodils will cease to flower.

Tulips: Lovely but need protection from deer and rabbits, and squirrels love the taste of the bulbs! Grow them in full sun with protection from browsing animals. Many colors/varieties to choose from.

Hyacinth: My personal favorite, hyacinths bloom in a variety of colors, are not eaten by anything and smell divine. They also die back relatively quickly, unlike daffodils. Plant them with pansies for a truly stunning Spring show. If a friend buys you potted hyacinths at Easter, plant them in your garden when they start to fade. They will return next Spring for you to enjoy again and again.

All bulbs like good soil. Add some compost to your soil when planting to lighten our dense clay and provide nutrients. Plant bulbs at least as deep as it says on the instructions. They will still find their way to the surface in the Spring and it lessens the likelihood of you digging them up by mistake when you forget where you planted them!







TENNIS NEWS

GOLD MEDAL WINS FOR HH TENNIS

Heritage Hunt Tennis players won a number of medals at the Northern Virginia Senior Olympics (NVSO) which held tennis singles and doubles in September. Entrants compete by age group. Heritage Hunt sent two singles players and two doubles teams to play in the 70's age group and one doubles team in the 80's age group. Pat McCarthy and Chris Omohundro, our 80's group representatives, then proceeded to win easily to take home the gold, with an 8-0 win in the finals. "We really felt that we had to be ready and at the top of our game," Omohundro said after capturing the top spot in his division in his first time playing in the Senior Olympics.

"I am really happy that we had so much interest in the Senior Olympics and that we could test our abilities against others in Northern Virginia," said Pat. "We have a number of strong tennis players so we have an opportunity to have good tennis on a daily basis. The new courts as well as the Howard Smith Pavilion also helped in building a tennis program."

Congratulations to all the winners. With four gold, two silver, and one bronze; the Heritage Hunt NVSO tennis legacy continues.

"It is great to see the growth of Heritage Hunt tennis, although I am not surprised to see the wins due to the level of play that has become commonplace on our courts," noted Joe Clark, one of the viewers in the gallery, who could not play due to an injury. Mr. Paul Kyte Boyd, Ph. D, 88, of Gainesville, passed away September 14, 2023, at the UVA – Haymarket Medical Center.





Q: HOW CAN BUNCHING MY CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS LOWER MY TAX BILL?

A: Bunching donations is when you make 2+ years of charitable contributions in a single year to increase your total itemized deductions to an amount greater than the standard deduction. In doing so, you are able to itemize deductions for that year, and then take the standard deduction in the following years.

Example:

Let's say you and your spouse file taxes as married, filing jointly. Each year, you give \$15,000 to charity and have \$10,000 in other itemized deductions. This would add up to \$25,000 in total itemized deductions, which is less than the 2023 standard deduction of \$27,700. If you did this every year, taking the standard deduction would make sense.

Now, if you were to bunch your charitable gifts for both 2023 and 2024 into 2023, your total 2023 itemized deductions would equate to \$40,000 (\$30,000 in charitable gifts and \$10,000 in other deductions). This is greater than the 2023 standard deduction, thus allowing you to itemize your deductions for a larger deduction. As your 2024 expected charitable gift was made in 2023, your 2024 total itemized deductions would be \$10,000, less than the 2024 projected standard deduction of \$29,200. By using this approach, your total deductions for 2023 and 2024 would be \$69,200 instead of \$56,900. This is an increase of \$12,300 in deductions over the same two years, simply by bunching your charitable contributions in one year.

CONCLUSION

There are many factors to take into account when deciding whether or not a bunching strategy is appropriate for you. If you are interested in how a bunching strategy may reduce your overall tax burden, please reach out to your tax advisor.


