NOVEMBER BOARD BRIEFS

Another year has zoomed by and the holidays are fast approaching. Your Board is hard at work to complete as many projects as we can before the end of 2024 to make sure we get off to a good start in 2025. This has been a very eventful year but we have accomplished a lot of what we had planned to get done.

We have a new Point of Sale (POS) system (Jonas) in place and our website has been updated to allow for better navigation of areas and topics. We had a few bumps in the road but we thank CAMP for their ongoing efforts to keep on top of all issues and resolve them.

We also changed out our Food/Beverage and Golf Club Service vendors. Our new Food/Beverage Vendor, CulinArt Group has been here since 7/1/24 and after some bumps in the road with equipment, exhaust hoods/fans and general maintenance, we are onto great meals and great customer service from their team. The new Golf Vendor, Landscape Golf Management, will soon start transition work from UTP and will be all set to take over golf operations on 1/1/25. A Community meeting to meet the Landscape Golf Management team will be planned and all residents are welcome to attend. Details to follow.

Prince William Water does seem on track to finish up the pump station/force main work in Heritage Hunt by the end of 1/25 and then we will see road work repairs on Heritage Hunt Drive, Fieldstone and Alderwood, as well as planned repairs on all our roads. The Board, CAMP and the Grounds Committee will be very involved in that work and the Community will be alerted every step of the way.

We have lingering issues with Master Plan projects. We need to resolve what we can complete and what maybe more of a priority to do such as trade out added parking spaces for connecting the Clubhouse or prioritize other needs that have come up since the master Plan Phase 1 was set up.

We also have the issue of the Paycheck Protection Plan and the Department of Justice's Civil Investigative Demand to us as regards to a loan we applied for in April 2020, did receive, used and was forgiven in May of 2021. We have complied with all DOJ requests and now it is a matter of waiting to see what comes next. CAMP, our HOA attorneys and our insurance companies are all aware of the issue and are keeping on top of it for and with us.

Immediate "to do's" are getting the budget done and out to the Community by the end of November. The Budget is set to be approved at the Thursday November 21st Board meeting. We will also have our annual meeting December 3rd. At that time we will wrap up the year and there will be in person voting at that meeting for declared candidates for the Board and Committees. Proxy and Electronic voting starts November 4th. We do thank all Homeowners who volunteered to run and serve. Our best to you all.

At the October 26 meeting, the Board reviewed the following resolutions. Due to Horn publishing dates these are being reported a month late. For a quicker review, please go to the Board page on the HH website as the meeting minutes will be there no later than 2 weeks after each meeting.

- Approved creating a new Administrative Resolution #36 creating a Surveillance Camera policy for all HH facilities.
- Approved creating a new Administrative Resolution #37 on authority and procedures for the Emergency Preparedness Committee to operate the T Communicator System.
- Approved termination of a contact with Exceptional Wildlife and initiating a new contract with Capital Goose for goose chasing on the golf course and common areas.
- Approved a food inventory write off of \$46421.40 due to the transition of a new food/beverage services provider.
- Approve a 5% increase in golf dues for new annual members and non-members paying daily green fees who join after 7/31/24 12/31/24.
- Approved awarding a contract to V. M. Drainage and Erosion Solutions NTE \$65,000 for new concrete and drainage Bocce court repairs as an unfunded item from Major Projects Reserves.
- Approved a contact to Special Services of Virginia NTE \$65,000 for renovation of the Clubhouse lower level bathrooms from the Repair and Replacement Reserves.
- Approved an unfunded budget item to replace the failing automatic door at the Fitness Center from Repair and Replacement Reserve NTE \$8,300.





EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

EPC EMERGENCY VOLUNTEER EXERCISE 2024 (EVX24)



You may have noticed some of our emergency volunteers walking the streets recently in their stunning yellow vests. The annual exercise for

Emergency Volunteers (EVs) was held on the morning of October 9, 2024, simulating response to a hurricane passing directly over Northern Virginia. Overall, EVX24 successfully exercised the Heritage Hunt (HH) Emergency Coordination System (HHECS) as being discussed in this photo from our debrief. The Emergency Coordination Center (ECC) and all three Community Information Points (CIPs) were established and 23 EVs and Hams participated in the exercise. You may also have noticed pink plastic folders taped to many electrical/cable boxes throughout the community. These had simulated issues or emergency for the EVs to report. The EVs, conducted survey patrols, found all of these issues and responded appropriately. With many people so busy on weekends, this exercise was held on a weekday.



You may have noticed our new maps of the community in the Clubhouse, and these were a great help in visualizing what and where some of the damage was located

throughout HH. As shown in the photo from the South Zone CIP, the new map appears in the background as two EVs report to the Zone Director. The combination of using ham radios and walkie talkies between EVs and the different command posts improved communications from previous years. The hams also provide the

capability to talk to support/response agencies outside of Heritage Hunt. This is important as we have seen in recent hurricanes around the country where the 911 system and cell phone towers and service have gone down.

Some areas need improvement, and the Emergency Preparedness Committee will be working on these. Heritage Hunt has a T-communicator system to send recorded messages to groups of people via telephones. Groups can be specific such as only EVs or can be to all residents for an impending emergency. This did not perform as expected and you will hear more about this in future Horn articles and system tests.

The biggest problem we had was the limited number of EVs available to survey the streets for damages to houses, facilities, or injuries to residents. The overall survey effort is the same but more EVs means the workload is more evenly distributed. We would ask everyone to look on the HOA website and see what EVs do for the community and consider signing up to be a volunteer. As our EV residents become older, we need new residents to help take their place and continue our potentially lifesaving work.



Beautyberry (Callicarpa americana) is a shrub that is native to our area and adapts well to growing conditions from part shade to full sun, from moist soil to dry. It reaches 4-6 feet in height and width and produces beautiful clusters of berries. Just make sure you have the plant tagged with the above name and not the Japanese version! 





Bernard J. "Bud" Winn Jr., age 89, passed away peacefully on September 3, 2024, at the Martinsburg VA Medical Center in West Virginia, surrounded by his loving family. Born on June 21, 1935, in

Syracuse, New York, Bud led a life filled with dedication to his country, his family, and his passions.

A proud veteran, Bud served in the United States Air Force and was stationed at Tan Son Nhut Air Base in Vietnam from 1969 to 1970, where he was injured during an attack. A medic informed him he would be sent home and receive a Purple Heart, but Maj. Winn declined so that he could finish his assignment. For his bravery and dedication, he was awarded the Bronze Star and received the Air Force Commendation Medal for Meritorious Service. Bud retired from the Air Force with full honors, and in December 2022, he was granted 100% disability for his service.

Bud started his distinguished military career logging many flight hours on T-28A and T-34A aircraft while assigned to the Fireball 3305th PTG. As an Atlas Missile Combat Crew Commander (MCCC) in 1963, he commanded a four-man crew during the Cuban Missile crisis, a tense period of history that he reflected on frequently. After his retirement from the military, Bud served as a Lockheed Advisor to the Royal Saudi Air Force's F-15 program, sharing his expertise and dedication to aviation and National defense on an international scale.

Bud was passionate about everything to do with airplanes and sailboats. He found joy in skiing, gardening, camping, and salmon fishing, and while stationed in Alaska, he even shot a moose. His pride and joy was driving his blue TR4 sports car, which brought him many happy memories. In addition to his military achievements, Bud founded the first Heritage Hunt, Gainesville, VA chapter of the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) and served as its president for four years, contributing to the community he cherished. Bud married the love of his life, Shirley Rose Hanson, on January 5, 1967, and together they shared a beautiful life. He was a devoted father to six children: Robert Winn of Moreno Valley, CA; Pamala Winn-Blair of San Angelo, TX; Heidi Flynn of Wardensville, WV; Kristen Winn of Bellingham, WA; Michael Winn of McLean, VA; and William Winn of Winchester, VA. He was also a proud grandfather to 12 grandchildren and a loving great-grandfather to six great grandchildren. Bud is also survived by his sister, Mary Johnson of St. Louis, MO.

He will be laid to rest with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, VA. In lieu of flowers, the family requests donations be made in Bud's memory to the Alzheimer's Association or a charity of your choice.


