



#### **OCTOBER BOARD BRIEFS**

Fall is upon us and we are getting ready for "falling" temperatures, along with leaves. One hopes we can get in some wonderful "leaf looking" before that happens.

We also look forward to getting our new lobby furniture this month so we can move forward to complete our renovations of the upstairs and downstairs lobby areas. Sincere thanks to the Facilities Committee for their hard work to get this very involved and complex project done. We also thank our residents for their patience during this entire process.

Patience has also come into play with all the work that PWCSA has had to do to lay the 24" force main pipe on Heritage Hunt Drive. The front gate exit gate closure from 9/5- 9/7 went well despite some issues with back gate exiting. However, the cooperation of PWCSA, their contractor Archer Western, our CAMP management, as well as our Grounds and Emergency Preparedness Committees, all made this as "painless" as it could be for the circumstances. Work will now be focused on getting the pipe line over to the Golf Course area and connected by mid 2024 to the under construction new pump station. We make every effort to update the community on this progress and especially those folks that are the closest to any construction areas. We thank you all.

We also thank residents who have filed Declarations of Candidacy for open seats on the Board and the Committees. There are as ever more seats to fill and Declarations will be accepted until 5 pm on Friday, October 6th. There will be a Meet the Candidates session on Friday November 3rd and voting starts Monday November 6 until the Annual Meeting on December 5 from 3-5 pm in the Clubhouse Ball Room.

There are elected Committees and there are appointed Committees. LSTV is an appointed Committee not an elected Committee and they are always seeking more interested residents to join them. Another nonelected Committee was our Advisory Committee for Strategic Planning. That Committee is on hiatus and we are seeking interested residents who would be interested in working on strategic planning for Heritage Hunt.

That group met quarterly and worked on updates as need to a strategic plan. We are in the midst of revising the current one, an effort which Board member Robert Ruffolo is leading. Residents who would like more information please contact boardofdirectors@heritagehunt.net.

- Approved revisions to the Facilities Committee Charter/Administrative Resolution #13.
- Approved JD Edwards to replace rotted wood trim and siding at the Marsh Mansion and then repaint the building exterior.
- Approved HLS to replacement trees on the Walnut Hill buffer area.
- Denied suggested revisions by Management to the current Contract Manual/Administrative Resolution #26 as the Board felt the current wording needed to be retained.

NEW SOLAR RESOURCES FROM PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY.

Prince William County has taken a lot of mystery out of hiring solar contractors and providing solar contractors' track records. PWC has developed a website with information about:

- · Selection of a contractor.
- What the contractor should provide in the planning process (you need to submit the same items to the Heritage Hunt ARC along with your DRA).
- A link to a document that gives contractor performance statistics such as number of solar projects completed in PWC, time from receipt of the county's receipt of the plans to time to final inspection, and time in the planning process.





### EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

HOW WE PREPARE TO KEEP HERITAGE HUNT SAFE DURING EMERGENCIES



September is National Preparedness Month. Every year the Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) conducts an Exercise using our Emergency Volunteers and the Heritage Hunt Ham Radio Club. This Exercise gains importance as, unfortunately, across the country there have been several tragic incidents that have revealed how not being prepared can result in loss of life. So, the EPC wants to thank our EVs and members of the Ham Radio Club that took the time to help us test our response to natural or man-made disasters and determine how well we can communicate when Heritage Hunt phone service is lost. We also want to encourage our residents to join us as an Emergency Volunteer (EV). Once you put on the yellow vest and grab your walkie-talkie, you can help mitigate emergencies, to prevent them from becoming tragic, by joining us to ensure your neighbors, friends, and family are protected.

Normally our First Responders can be here within minutes. However, when faced with an area wide emergency county resource will be limited so we need to be prepared. This includes the EVs that survey Heritage Hunt for facility or utility damage, medical emergencies, and other disruptions so they can be reported by radio when phone service is lost. Heritage Hunt is divided into three Zones (South, North-East and North-West) to facilitate our response to emergencies. Zone command centers are setup in the Club House, Marsh Mansion, and the Golf Maintenance Facility. Zone Command Centers

report to the Emergency Coordination Center, in the Club House, allowing us to track emergencies and obtain First Responder support via our emergency communication capabilities. Loss of electrical power will be mitigated by having our four emergency generators to allow the EPC to continue to communicate across Heritage Hunt and reach out to county emergency services.

We also provide training to our EVs on life saving techniques to be used if there is a delay in obtaining outside emergency support during a major weather event or other emergency incident. Even when there is no area wide emergency, we still want our residents to be safe and therefore we will be presenting a "Fall Prevention Class" on Thursday, October 12, 2023, at 11:00 am in the Clubhouse Mountain View Room. So come learn about how your balance, medication, vision, environment, and health conditions affect your safety. This will be followed on Wednesday, October 18th, with another offering of our Hands Only CPR/AED Class, also at the Marsh Mansion at 10:00 am. To reserve your seat for these courses, please contact us at CPRHHEPC@gmail.com.

The EPC will continue to work to keep those at Heritage Hunt healthy and safe, but we need your help. So please join us by volunteering as an Emergency Volunteer if you are able (applications are available at the Front Desk). For all residents, be prepared by signing up for our health and safety training courses, adding the T-Comm number (703) 743-2016 into all your phones as "T-Comm Heritage Hunt" so you will receive what could be lifesaving notifications, and finally, remove and review the Emergency Guidance insert from the middle of the August Horn or get one at the Front Desk so you will be ready to respond to an emergency. As always, we want you to be prepared, so Heritage Hunt, instead of becoming a tragic incident, sets an example by keeping everyone healthy and safe.

Are you a curious person? Want to learn how things work? Do you like solving problems in creative ways? Then you might really enjoy being part of our committed and hard-working Facilities Committee.

The Facilities Committee keeps an eye out for problems or needs that we see in the buildings in Heritage Hunt, and we pass these issues along to CAMP's Facilities Manager. We are responsible for the maintenance of the Clubhouse, Fitness Center, (both indoor and outdoor pools,) the tennis, pickleball, and bocce courts, Marsh Mansion, the Golf Maintenance building, the Sand Shed, comfort stations on the golf course, and the gazebo on Paddock Pond!


#### FINE ARTS GROUP

She says, "Genealogy is never done, it is never complete, and it is not written in stone. Solving a problem or throwing a wrench into years of work only takes ONE document. I think I will be working on trying to figure out the origins of my Combs family for the rest of my life." 

#### **GROUNDS COMMITTEE**



October is here! One of the most delightful months of the year weather-wise, unless we get a hurricane descending on us! Do get out in your garden or take a walk around Talleyrand and Paddock Ponds to enjoy the cool fall days.

#### Update on CMBS:

Please remain vigilant about checking your crape myrtle trees for those little white spots on the trunk and/or branches of the tree, indicating that the tree is being attacked by CMBS – Crape Myrtle Bark Scale. If you see any, scrub them off with some soapy water. If you see any that are too high to reach, blast them off with your hose. Follow up with an insecticidal drench mixed with water and poured around the base of the tree from the drip line, going in towards the trunk about 3 feet. You all have done a great job this summer at keeping this new pest under control. Keep up the good work!

#### Gas-Powered Leaf Blowers:

A Word About Cutting Back Shrubs and Over-Mulching.

Many of you employ landscapers to mow your lawns and mulch your beds. That's fine, but they sometimes do things in your garden which are not correct. One of these practices is becoming more prevalent and it is damaging your flowering shrubs. THE FALL IS NOT THE TIME TO PRUNE YOUR SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS. Rhododendrons including Azaleas, Weigela, Viburnum, Forsythia, Bridal-Veil Spirea, Lilacs, Mock Orange, Virginia Sweetspire and most

Hydrangeas bloom on old wood and have already set their buds. If they get cut back in the fall, they do not bloom the following year so if you want to have flowers on them next season, leave them alone. Also, be careful not to over-mulch with wood or bark chips. Too much mulch can prevent water and air getting to the roots of your plants. They still need to be hydrated even in the winter. And we all know about tree mulch-mountains now I hope, so make sure you can see the root flare at the base of your trees and pull back any mulch which covers that. The maxim here is: 'Mulch out, not up'.

#### Advocating for the Insects:

In your efforts to clean up your garden for the coming winter months, please spare a thought for the insects who need dried stalks, leaf litter and dead wood to hibernate in and lay their eggs for the next generation. Some native bees need patches of bare earth to burrow into. So please don't be too diligent in your desire for neatness, and please don't ask us to 'tidy-up' those areas of our community which have been left as nature intended.



# Q: ARE MY SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS SUBJECT TO INCOME TAX?

**A:** A portion of your Social Security benefits may be subject to income tax if your modified adjusted gross income (MAGI), plus 1/2 of your Social Security benefits, exceeds specified limits.

### HOW DO I CALCULATE MY MAGI?

In short, your MAGI is your adjusted gross income plus your tax-exempt interest income and income earned outside of the U.S. that is exempt from tax.

# HOW MUCH OF MY SOCIAL SECURITY COULD BE TAXED?

Up to 50% of your Social Security benefits may be subject to income tax if your "combined income" (MAGI plus 1/2 of your Social Security benefits) is within the following ranges:

- Filing as Single: \$25,000 \$34,000
- Married filing jointly: \$32,000 \$44,000
- Filing as Head of household: \$25,000 \$34,000
- Filing as Qualifying widow(er) with dependent child: \$25,000 \$34,000
- Married filing separately: see below

If your combined income exceeds \$34,000 (\$44,000 if married and filing jointly), up to 85% of your benefits may be taxable. If you are married and filing separately, up to 85% of your benefits may be taxed unless you and your spouse lived apart for the entire year (then the single filer thresholds apply).

## RICK LAMONTAGNE HIGHLIGHT



Rick LaMontagne and his wife Shirley moved to Heritage Hunt in 2010 after an extensive East Coast search. They lived in Burke, VA at the time and it took them over a year to finally get a

place on the golf course. A dream come true.

They have been active in Heritage Hunt, Shirley with the Ladies 9 Hole league and Rick with LSTV and the HOA Board. Rick has been with LSTV since 2012 and served on the HOA Board in 2017 and 2018.

Rick was born in Massachusetts and received a BS degree in Electrical Engineering from Southeastern Mass University. After graduation he took a job with Sylvania Electric but this was during Vietnam and the Government very quickly sent him a draft notification. He decided to enlist in the AF, but after boot camp, he applied for Officer Training School and received a Commission in the AF as a 2nd Lt in Feb of 1969. He was assigned to AF Systems Command.

Rick had a very successful career in the AF. In 1979, he was recognized as Program Manager of the Year at the AF Space Division in Los Angeles CA. In 1980, he was selected as an AF Research Fellow for a one year fellowship at the Rand Corporation in Santa Monica, CA. In 1986, he was recognized as the Communications Analyst of the Year for AF Studies and Analysis, at the Pentagon, Washington, DC. In 1989, his program was awarded For Management Excellence at the AF Electronics Division, in Boston, MA. Along the way, he also got a Master of Science Degree in System Management from the University of Southern California. Rick Retired from the AF in May 1990 and worked for a number of different companies including Pratt Whitney, WorldCom and Harris Corp.

LSTV was still using analog equipment when Rick

joined the group. It was a busy time, with equipment needing tender loving care (TLC) every week to keep it running. Climbing into the attic of the Clubhouse and Marsh Mansion or into the telephone and Comcast terminal rooms with wires snaking in every direction was a common challenge every week. In 2016, Rick was a member of the LSTV committee that brought LSTV into the digital age. The first project was the digital sound system. From developing specifications, evaluating proposals and selecting a contractor the team worked many hours getting approvals and funding from the Board and awarding the contract. That was followed by the installation and testing. A very exciting time. A few years later, we also digitized the Video and Lighting systems which considerably simplified its operation.

Over the years Rick has worked with Men in Song, the HH Little Theater, and many of the Talent and Christmas shows that LSTV has supported.

Rick will tell you that the digitization of the Sound and Lighting systems has made them pretty easy to operate. You don't have to be techie. When you walk by our control booth in the back of the Ballroom and see all that equipment you may tell yourself I can't do that. We can prove you wrong. It's just pushing the buttons and sliding a few sliders. Besides we train you to become an expert. Give us a try. You have nothing to lose and may learn something. How fun is that? 








# **TEARS**

### TONY ROBERTS



Tony Roberts peacefully passed away on August 25, 2023 with his wife and family by his side.

Tony was born into an Italian family on the south side of Chicago, where he grew up loving baseball, Wrigley Field and the

Chicago Cubs. After high school he was drafted into the Army and honorably served in support of the Korean War where he earned the United Nations Service Medal and Korean Service Medal. Following his military service, Tony graduated from Columbia College with a degree in Journalism and began his career as an announcer in Clinton, Iowa. He worked at different stations in Illinois and Indiana calling high school basketball games. His broadcast career quickly expanded to college baseball, basketball and play-by-play for Indiana University Football.

In 1970 he came to Washington, DC to join WWDC, where he would become one of the voices of the Washington Senators before the team moved to Texas in 1972. His work in Washington continued as he became the play-by-play announcer for Naval Academy Football and Washington Bullets (now Wizards) basketball. Recognition for Tony's work resulted in several accolades to include seven Associated Press Sports Reporting awards and seven DC Sportscaster of the Year awards.

In 1979, he joined the Mutual Broadcasting System, now known as Westwood One Sports, where his prominence as a broadcaster would be nationally recognized. Tony would spend 27 years working for Mutual/ Westwood One. His experience prepared him for a Hall of Fame career as one of the most renowned sports voices in America. His extensive career included covering several Winter and Summer Olympic Games, NBA

Basketball, the College Baseball World Series, NFL Football, NCAA College Basketball, PGA, and several major college bowl games for decades.

Tony is best known as the Voice of Notre Dame Football from 1980-2006. Tony's calls of Notre Dame Football were legendary. His dramatic descriptions of the Fighting Irish on the gridiron and his signature call "Touchdown Irish" are memories fans have cherished for years.

Lifetime accomplishments include being inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame, the Indiana Broadcasters Hall of Fame, and the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. In 2005 Tony was honored by the College Football Hall of Fame receiving the prestigious Chris Schenkel award. This award honors a broadcaster who's had a distinguished career broadcasting College Football, recognizes their direct ties to colleges and universities and commitment to excellence in broadcasting. A fitting tribute to a man who provided so many thrills to generations of Notre Dame fans worldwide. His seven-decade career culminated with his induction into the National Radio Hall of Fame in 2016.

Tony and Shirley moved into Heritage Hunt in 2000 and have enjoyed many gatherings with neighbors and friends over the years. Tony enjoyed golfing and breakfast with his men's group, which was they refer to as the "Romeos" (retired old men eating out).

During their life together, Tony and Shirley enjoyed traveling around the world and made solid friendships along the way which they cherished dearly. Tony had the most amazing gift of touching people's lives with his handwritten letters, cards, words of wisdom, and ability to brighten their day with conversation and a smile. He had a genuine heart and a strong Catholic faith which guided him through a well-lived life. He always believed in the power of prayer and spreading God's word to those in need.

Tony is survived by his loving and caring wife Shirley, their combined seven children Lance, Tracey, Kerry, Daryle, Keith, Tricia, and Kevin, six grandchildren, his brother Arthur, numerous cousins, nephews and nieces who will miss him greatly.




